

WATERLOO

I just wanted to drop you a line or so to fill you in on what has been happening here in Waterloo this spring and summer. I am actively pitching in two leagues this season. The Evansdale bar league and the Waterloo handicap league that I started up at Byrnes park. It has begun to spark some interest among some of the other pitchers in each league. For instance, in the bar league, one of the teams we pitched saw the article in the local Paper about my winning one of the winter Eldora tournaments, and commented about it. I took the opportunity to tell them about the winter schedule and all the tournaments that go on there. Several of them expressed interest in pitching tournaments there next winter.

As far as the Waterloo league has been going, most of the pitchers are folks who have played in our league before. We do have one new team of six guys who are real interested. I have already directed them to Leo Buell to get some good pitching shoes to replace the picnic shoes they now have. We may end up getting some of those guys to a tournament. They really have asked a lot of questions and were surprised at all the pitching that goes on across the country.

As for me personally, in the handicap league I am generally Getting my behind shellacked on a regular basis. Our handicap system favors the lower pitcher and really puts the pressure on the better pitcher. I really have to pitch well to win most games. I've put together a couple of 60% plus games and won those but average generally doesn't give me a win. I have to pitch over my average in most cases to record wins. That is to my liking though because it pressures me to pitch well. The team concept we use also gives me two teammates to help so we are holding our own in the league.

I had initially planned to try and hold a tournament this summer in Waterloo, but currently with only 6 and a half courts, I don't think that is advisable at this time.

Some of the bar league pitchers are also pitching the handicap league and some have seen a noticeable improvement in their game due to the added night of pitching. That in turn has sparked interest by other bar league pitchers in the handicap league, so if we should manage to get our two new courts I don't think I would have too much trouble getting two more teams put together for the handicap league.

I guess that's about all the news for now. Thanks. Pat Simon

PANGERS REMEMBERED – Kevin Cone (from NHPA News Digest, January 1986)

Since the game of horseshoe is a family game, many times in our history two or three members of the same family have participated in the championship division of the World Tournament in the same year. For example, in 1984, three sisters were in the Women's Championship division. Phyllis Negaard, Sandy Karasch and Beverly Nathe, all of Minnesota. Also in 1984, Curly(Intermediate Men), Bonnie(Women) and Mark (Men) Siebold were all in Championship groups of their respective classes. But the family that had the most members in a championship group in the same year was the Frank Jackson family whose hometown was Kellerton, Iowa. In the 1928 World Tournament in St. Petersburg, Florida, February 20 to March 1, the Jackson family had 5 placed in the Chamionship group of 30 men. In the Championship preliminaries, Frank Jackson was 5th place while his four sons - Carroll, Vyril, Hansford, and Herbert - finished 7th, 9th, 12th and 22nd respectively. 12 men went on to the finals, with Frank finishing 5th, Carroll 8th, Hansford 9th and Vyril 12th in the World. These four Jacksons were in the Championship group together three different years: 1927, 1928, and 1934. In 1924 Frank finished 2nd and son, Hansford, 3rd in the World.

Frank Jackson was one of the greatest pitchers of all time because he was able to change with the times. The first year averages were kept was 1923, and Frank finished 4th with a 48.5% average using shoes straight off of horses. In 1934, using modern pitching shoes, Frank set a world record for qualifying with 125 ringers out of 150 shoes for an 83.3%. In 1935, his last World Tournament, Frank finished 5th with a 72.9% average. Frank's world tournament career went from 1909 to 1935; he was recognized World Champion in 1909, 1914, 1915, 1920, 1921 and 1926, and accumulated 517 wins out of 606 games in World Tournament Championship play. A charter member of the Iowa Sports Hall of Fame, Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame and NHPA Hall of Fame, Frank Jackson – born 1870, died 1955 – is a ringer remembered.


DEAR FRIENDS OF HORSESHOES
