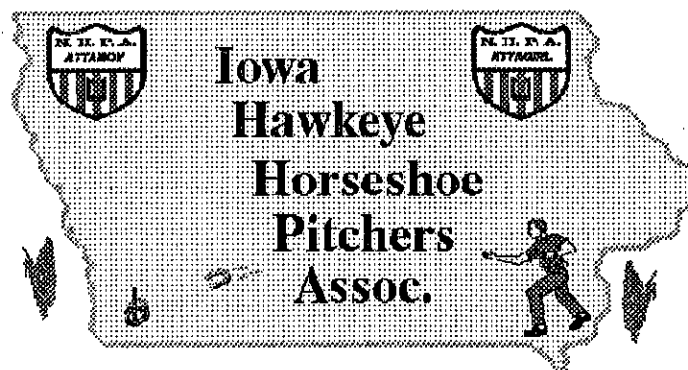

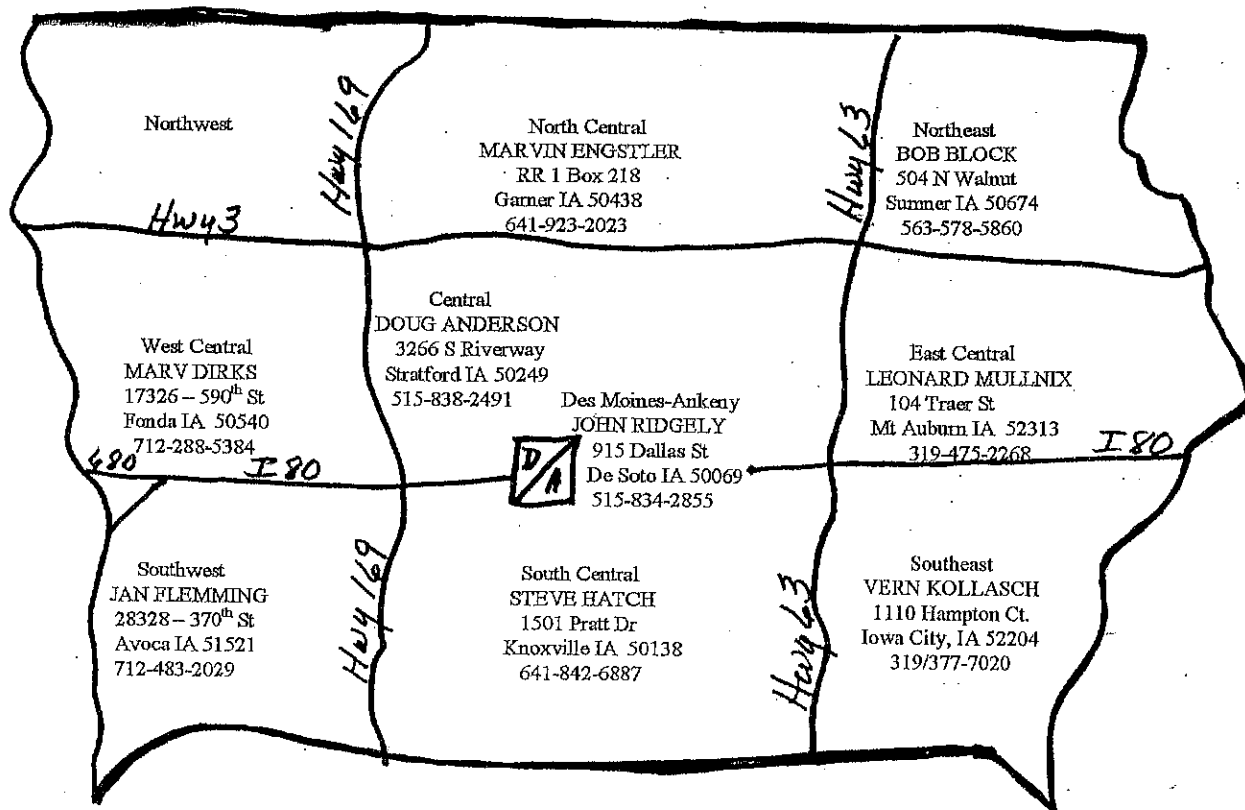
The Frank Jackson Award is for one individual who has done the most for the advancement of horseshoe pitching in Iowa the past year.

weather.*

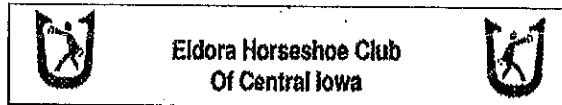
*Of course, our Indoor Court insures you of that

Just to keep peace with my old man!*

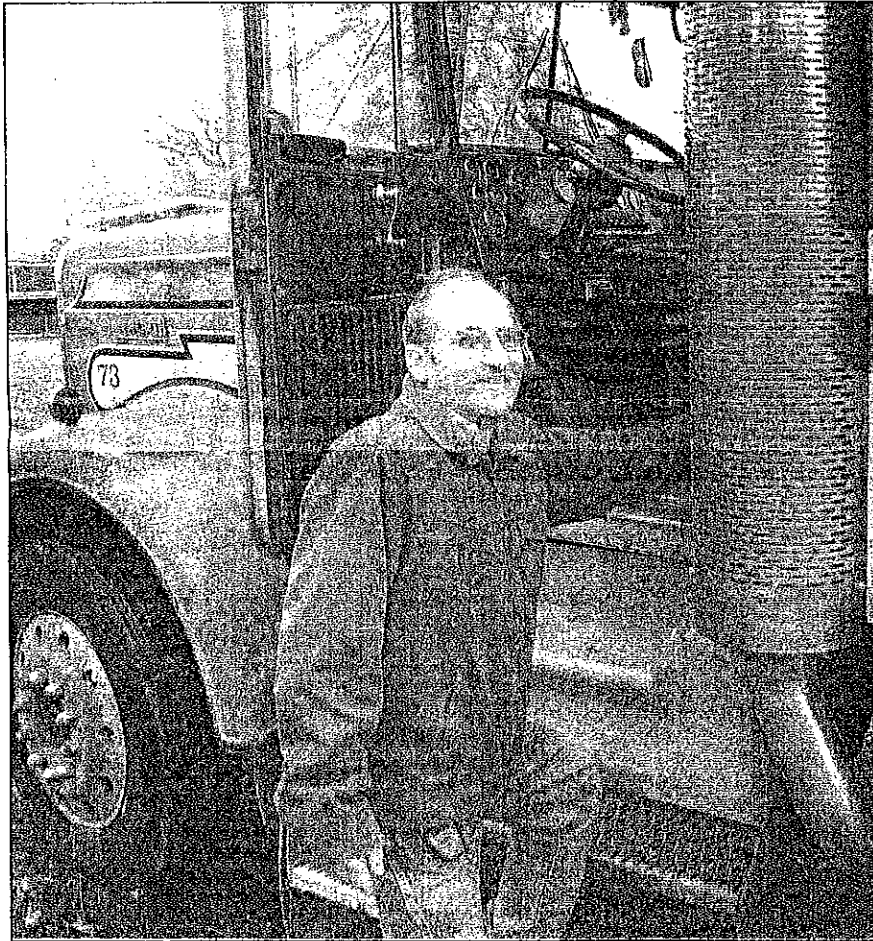

KEEP ON TRUCKIN'

Dialysis doesn't keep this driver pulled over

GILMAN — On average, one area man spends 50 hours a week in the seat of an 18-wheeler hauling loads of steel across the Midwest, and he prepares for it by spending 16 hours a week in the seat of a dialysis machine.

Denny Burgess loves driving, loves his truck and is loving life, without kidneys.

"It's all I ever wanted to do, drive truck," he said.

Even before his fifth birthday — in

the midst of countless surgeries to try to correct kidney complications that arose shortly after birth — Burgess was gripping his fingers around bowls and driving an imaginary truck.

The 49-year-old's right kidney was taken out in 1968.

"Many summer vacations were spent at Iowa City trying something different," he said. "I always had some obstacle going on."

Nearly a decade later, faced with the possibility of not being able to drive a truck for a living, Burgess studied to

be a diesel truck mechanic. At least he could be close to trucks, he thought.

He never even began that career because a doctor cleared him to drive in 1979.

For seven years, Burgess lived his dream, trucking coast to coast and seeing some of America's natural wonders, like a Washington river so clear he could see fish swimming in it from quarter of a mile above.

His left kidney quit in February 1986.

Determined to stay in the driver's seat, Burgess opted to do dialysis at home, and at night.

"That's his life. He is very happy when he's in the truck. It's his second home," said his wife Marcia.

Burgess hauled grain then, and developed a second family among the other truckers he frequently ran into.

"It's just like a big family. You sit in line and talk to people. Everyone knows everyone," Burgess said.

"They all keep track of him, always asking how he's doing," Marcia said.

Another opportunity to correct his life-long struggles with kidney problems arrived in 1993 — a kidney transplant.

Burgess' brother Ron had a perfect kidney match, but his blood type was wrong, so their sister Jodi stepped forward to be the donor.

The transplant went by without clotting problems or rejection from the body, but a few days later it unexplainedly ruptured.

The three years that followed proved to be some of the most difficult days of his life.

"I was pretty sad, really depressed for a good year," Burgess said.

He sold his truck and switched to dialysis at a center in Grinell, where he did not have to worry about taking care of the machine.

Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday since he has traveled to Grinell, starting the 4.5-hour process at a quarter to 6 a.m.

"Other than putting needles in, there's no pain. I just sit through as the machine does its work," he said.

He can only drink a quart of liquids a day and has to be very careful about his diet, steering away from added salt and anything with high amounts of potassium, he said.

"If I follow my diet, I feel the same going in and coming

out," he said.

So in 1995 Burgess put his life back in gear.

"My dad used to get mad at me. He always thought I shouldn't be doing it, but I'd say, 'Dad, I'd go nuts if I didn't,'" he said.

He bought back his 1973 Kenworth W900, one of the manufacturer's 50th anniversary models that is so dear to him and so eye-catching to other truckers because of its age.

That truck has seen more than two million miles, two engines and numerous overhauls.

"He's become an inspiration to a lot of people, and he's made their day not as bad as they thought it was," Marcia said.

Being on dialysis, Burgess is limited to hauling in Iowa and its neighboring states. He now hauls mostly coiled and sheet steel from Marshalltown or Bettendorf, and his most popular destinations are Chicago, Minneapolis and St. Joseph, Mo.

"You never know what situation could come up, and he's got to be at the point where something could come to a halt so he could get taken care of," Marcia said.

Nevertheless, driving fever has not kept Burgess away from the road, and the bug has spread to Marcia as well. The couple, friends most of their lives, got married three years ago and now own two trucks, both of which sport mud flaps that read, "Give the gift of life. Be an organ donor. I am!"

"I had the idea of what better place to advertise than on my trailer," Burgess said, so he bought 50 sets of mud flaps in 1997 to spread awareness.

While the idea has not gone over as well as he imagined because "a lot of guys treat their trucks like their babies and white mud flaps with blue lettering doesn't really go with it," Burgess remains involved.

He is also a proponent of scientific research.

"With stem cell research, you could grow your own kidney and wouldn't need a transplant," he said. "Anti-rejection medicine usually gets people before the actual transplant."

However, progress has been slow in coming.

"Twenty years ago doctors thought pig kidneys would work in 10 years. Now they're still 10 years away," he said. "But I got the best one you can have. With hearts, lungs and livers, you don't have a machine to fall back on."

To celebrate that fact, every year since Burgess turned 40 family and friends have thrown a party. About 250 people were expected to fill the Melbourne recreation center yesterday for the most recent celebration.

They reminisced over the past 20 years by watching a slide show and enjoying another of Burgess' loves, music.

Born and raised by a musical Marshall County family, Burgess and Marcia are also part of a country music group, Prairie Lightning, and a family band, The Basics.

"It's good to be here. I explain to a lot of people that I don't have to be on dialysis, I get to be on dialysis. If you have that outlook, it makes all the difference in the world," he said.
