
#### STATE FAIRGROUND COURTS

# HHPA HALL OF FAME W. C. "Bill" Vandegriff

W. C. "Bill" VandeGriff was born December 10, 1916. He was married to Ruth, and had three children – Carol, Neil and Gayle. He was a graduate of Selma Consolidated Schools and later became President of the School Board.

Bill started pitching horseshoes at the age of 12 and began competing in tournaments in the 1950's. He threw a right handed, three-quarter turn and pitched Ted Allen Shoes. Several pitchers went to the Ottumwa Coliseum on Monday nights to throw shoes with Bill. He was a great help to many pitchers in Southeast Iowa.

In 1970, he was the Iowa State Champion, and in seven other State Championships, he placed second. He won the Class A Monmouth Open (Illinois) 1975-1977, and the Burlington Corn Belt Open in 1971-72. He played in the World Tournament Championship Division in 1975-1978. His best finish was 15<sup>th</sup> place, high tournament percentage was 78.9%; high game 95.4%. In 1987, he placed 10<sup>th</sup> in the World Senior Championship Class, pitching 58.39%.

Bill was a member of NHPA for 25 years, and served as an NHPA Regional Director. He was also a past President and Vice President of the IHHPA. He was inducted into the Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Hall of Fame in 1982.

Bill passed away on Tuesday, January 10, 2006, at his home in Fairfield, Iowa.

# ATTENTION REGIONAL DIRECTORS AND TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS

It is time to get the horseshoe courts in your area checked out for sanctioning. It takes about one hour to check a complex. I must have them checked this year and certify each court complex as a Conditional Sanctioned Court or a Full Sanctioned Court. Courts that do not receive a sanction certificate cannot have a 2008 sanctioned tournament. There are only 18 courts in the State of Iowa - - 19 with the courts at the State Fairgrounds. So far only five complexes have been checked. Where are the other 13? There are not many more months of good weather left and people will be thinking about football. Most courts are on public land and most cities will pay for the upgrades. All you have to do is ask. The city can also apply

for a grant through the NHPF. I know only a few people in lowa have donated to the NHPF, but it is there to issue grants to upgrade courts. Let's get those courts checked and the paperwork returned to me. Thanks!





"We'll see what happens." As I say goodbye, her father shakes my hand and thanks me. "Her mother would be proud," he says, smiling, "So proud,"

Before I leave, Mercdith tells me that when she outgrows the 4-H events, she'll start riding in FFA horse shows. The FFA's motto is straightforward: "Learning to Do, Doing to Learn, Earning to Live, Living to Serve." Compare that to "What Happens in Vegas Stays in Vegas," and you begin to see why 4-H and FFA events and the state and county fairs where they're held are so important -for parents and children alike,
