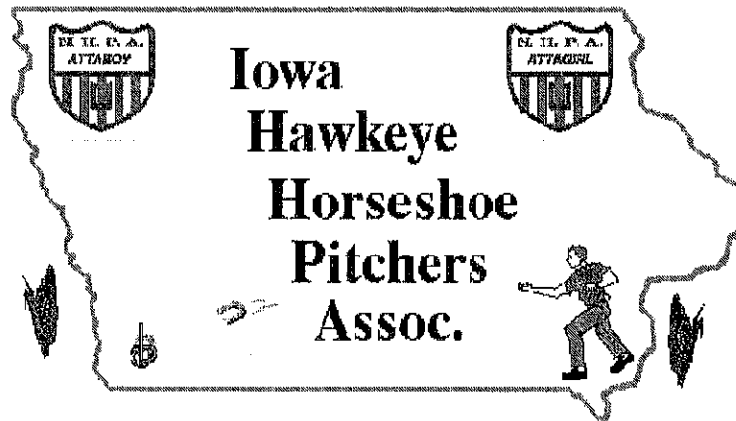

The Frank Johnson Award is given in honor of the first World and Iowa Champion, the legendary Frank Jackson of Kellerton, to that person who has given effort above the call of duty in advancement of horseshoe pitching in Iowa. Congratulations to this year's recipient **C. Leo Buell**.

The IHHPA Hall of Fame Award is to honor and perpetuate the names of those nominated members who have displayed outstanding ability in the game of horseshoes and/or who have contributed, through meritorious service, to the general welfare and progress of the game and/or who have pitched horseshoes for a great number of years. Congratulations to this year's recipient, **Harold Garner**. Harold will receive his award at the 2008 State Fair.

**IHHPA HALL OF FAME  
FRANK JACKSON**



Frank B. Jackson was born in 1870 and was a farmer in Kellerton, Iowa. He was a right-handed pitcher, and used a 2 and ¼ turn in the beginning and later went to a 1 and ¾ turn. He threw 60% to 72.3% in World Competition with a lifetime record of 519 wins and 89 losses. He averaged 60% at the Iowa State Championships.

In 1909, at the first horseshoe pitching tournament held in Bronson, Kansas, the game used 2-inch stakes on dirt courts. Jackson had acquired the skill of pitching a ringer over the 2-inch stake and then laying his second shoe on top so his opponent couldn't keep his ringer on. Jackson won the tournament, becoming the first recognized World Champion. He was awarded \$2.50 and a World Championship Belt with horseshoes attached to it. He also won the first tournament sanctioned by the NPHA in 1915. He continued to win World titles in 1920, 1921, 1925, 1926, and 1927, and was considered the World Champion during the intervening years 1910-1914 and 1916-1918.

Jackson was also the first Iowa State Champion in 1920 and again in 1921, 1927, 1928, 1929, 1930, 1932 and 1933. He was one of the seven charter members of the NHPA Hall of Fame in 1996, and also one of the seven charter members of the IHHPA Hall of Fame in 1976. In 1971 he was inducted into the Iowa Sports Hall of Fame, conducted by *The Des Moines Register*.

Jackson toured the nation with his three sons, Hanford, Carroll and Vyril, to spark interest in the game of horseshoe pitching. He passed away in 1955. In 1978 in Kellerton, street signs with horseshoes were erected and horseshoes were painted on the water tower in Jackson's memory and honor. On August 10, 1980, twelve new horseshoe courts were dedicated in his honor. Every year since 1982, the officers of the IHHPA present the "Frank Jackson Award" to the person who has done the most to promote the game of horseshoes.

## These Iowa Games athletes toss their shoes

Fourteen people, ranging from young and middle-aged adults to individuals more than 80 years old, gathered at Brookside Park Saturday for the horseshoes competition at the 2007 Iowa Games.

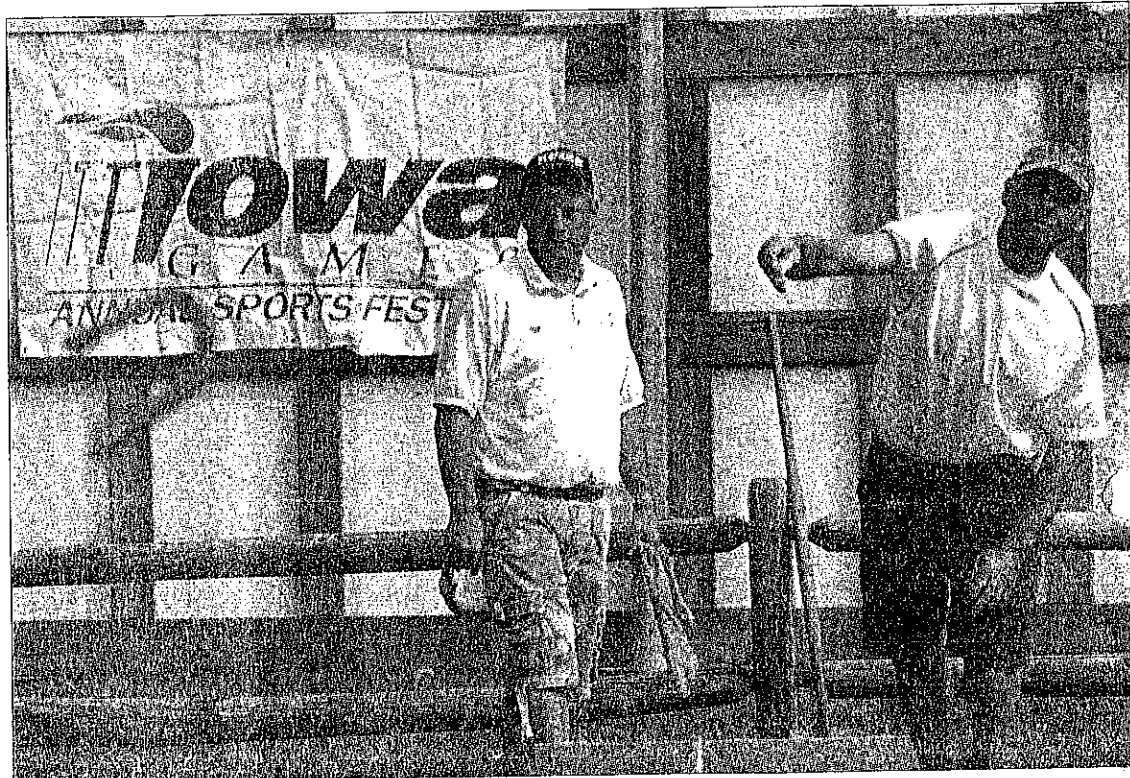
Participants were divided into three classes based on their ringer percentage from Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association tournaments or based on 100 recorded throws before the games.

They were to play six individual games of 40-shoe count-all, with final results determined by placement in each game.

Men threw the shoes from a distance of 40 feet. Women and seniors threw from 30 feet.

"It doesn't look very strenuous, but the horseshoes weigh two and a half pounds," said horseshoes commissioner Richard Carlson.

He said people develop a variety of throwing techniques. Throwing the shoes the right distance and on line with the stake with the front of the shoe facing it are crucial.

Competitors came to Ames from all around Iowa, including Leon, located near the state's southern border, Carlson said.

Ralph Davis, of Ankeny,

said he has been playing the sport for six years.

"I like it because of the friendly group of people that play together," he said. "It's kind of a game you play more

against yourself than the other person."

## Smith brothers bring home trophies

GLADBROOK — They're champions. They're brothers. They both lift a lot of iron. They just lift it in very different ways.

Brothers Joseph and Gage Smith, of Gladbrook, recently competed in separate title events held at the Iowa State Fair.

Joseph, 26, was back to protect his title as Iowa State Men's Horseshoe Pitching Champion, going undefeated in the 12-man competition. Throwing 22 ringers to win the championship, he received a Red Henton commemorative trophy, a wall plaque, a blue ribbon, a patch and cash

award.

Gage, 18, competed in the deadlift competition in the 148-165 pound class. Each competitor was allowed three attempts to deadlift as much Olympic weight iron as they could. Gage finished in first place for his class with a 405-pound deadlift.

Joseph will be hosting a NHPA sanctioned horseshoe pitching tournament in Eldora on Sept. 15. Registration is at 9:30 a.m. and anyone may obtain a NHPA membership at the courts in order to play that day.

# Here's the pitch

Horseshoes fan thinks NL is a ringer for new facility

NORTHLIBERTY—They have an international organization divided into national, state and local chapters. They have had their own Hall of Fame since 1966, world competitions since 1910 and a story of note in the Guinness World Records. They even have their own foundation.

Who knew horseshoe pitchers were so passionate about their sport?



North Liberty resident Bob Hardy knows; he pitched his first shoe at age 8. This past summer, Hardy was crowned Elder State Champion at the 2007 Iowa State Fair, at age 70. A member of the Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitching Association (IHHPA) and a 10-year competitive pitcher of the iron shoes, Hardy travels the state on summer weekends honing his skills by pitching against Iowa's 250 other IHHPA members. With a 57.05 percent ringer average, he also pitches in Florida during the winter months, and participates in the Florida Winter Games each year.

Hardy described the sport as economical, family-friendly, healthful and open to both men and women of all ability levels and ages. In Florida, there are pitchers still throwing well into their 90s, yet Hardy has been teaching his grandchildren to pitch since they were old enough to toss a shoe safely.

His only complaint about the sport is that it is difficult to do year-round in Southeast Iowa due to the lack of indoor horseshoes facilities.

"The biggest drawback to dampen my spirits is the weather, since all but a few tournaments are held outdoors," he said. "We have wonderful facilities throughout the state, but all are subject to mother nature."

While he often practices and competes at the outdoor facilities in Cedar Rapids and Iowa City, the nearest indoor courts are located in Eldora, which will hold events during the indoor season from November through April.

Hardy is now making a pitch to build an indoor, climate-controlled horseshoe pitching facility right here in the corridor.

Hardy thinks North Liberty would be the perfect place.

"I listened to the crop of recent council candidates say North Liberty needs to establish an identity. Well, why not have the first state-of-the-art indoor horseshoes pitching facility to brag about?"

Competition courts have regulations for layouts, pit size and surfaces, and all competitions have sanctioned equipment requirements.

"It isn't like you can just put up two stakes in a yard," Hardy said. A quality facility will have air conditioning and heat, scoreboards, good lighting and a place for spectators to watch contests or have refreshments.

A draftsman by trade, Hardy has even drawn up plans for such a facility currently being considered in Naples, Fla., but he'd really like to see something available here.

"North Liberty is a town that supports recreational activities," he noted. "Horseshoes seems like a natural fit."

It could also be a financial boon to the town, Hardy suggested, as horseshoe pitchers come from all over to get in on the weekend fun. Regional teams get together to compete at Iowa's state fair. The team world championship competition is held annually in Beloit, Wis., while the individual world championship games move to a new location each year. Last year, the IHHPA applied to hold the world championship in Cedar Rapids, but lost out to Springfield, Ill.

"The great thing about horseshoes is no one is left out," Hardy added. "At the recent tournament in Beloit, there was a person in a wheelchair and a one-armed man on the same team, and they placed second in the World Team Championship."

Hardy will soon be making his way to Florida, but plans to continue to try and hook others on the game of horseshoes wherever he happens to land. "What a wonderful pastime this has been for me," he said. "I hope others will catch the passion."
