



Good to see Harold Barker coming back to form. Also some younger players are really improving. I watched Ira Hartwick Making lots of progress.



ART BROWN, A PATTERSON STAR

Arthur Brown, the youngest child of Sam and Alice Brown was born April 19, 1919. Being the youngest of a "Baker's Dozen," Art no doubt was teased, tormented, and pampered. If he was spoiled, he outgrew it. HA! He took his place in the family doing his share of family chores.

Arthur attended Patterson Consolidated School. Being a small school, they did not engage in many extra activities. Baseball and basketball were the main sports. Art, being a good athlete, played both. Baseball was probably his favorite sport. He played center field and did a lot of pitching for his team. According to his good buddy, Loyde Lull, Art was known for his ability to hit home runs.

The Brown and Lull boys grew up with a ball glove in their hands. They lived across the road from each other and were very fortunate in having a cow pasture in front of their homes that was large and level enough for a good baseball field. Many ball games were played here on Sunday afternoons.

In 1934, the "St. Louis Cardinals" were known as a good ball team. These Patterson boys thought they were pretty "hot stuff," too. They gave each other names of the famous Cardinal player. Art's nickname was Dizzy Dean.

After graduation, the boys continued to play ball. Red Feaster, a clown in the Ringling Bros. Barnum and Bailey Circus, lived in the neighborhood and enjoyed playing ball with the boys. They thought baseball suits were a necessity, but had no money to buy them. Red told them he could get suits if they didn't care what color they were! Ted did get the suits, and they were good suits. Color?----well, they were red with orange lettering. Yes, you guessed it – the lettering said, "Ringling Bros. Barnum and Bailey Circus." The boys were these suits and had fun listening to comments and seeing the stares from the ball fans.

Later they gave themselves the name of the "Patterson Red Caps." One of their fond memories was the fact that they were able to beat a well know team out of Des Moines a couple times.

Arthur and his brother John, also played with a Winterset ball team. The late Pete Stevens and other Winterset boys were on the team.

His father died while Arthur was in high school, so after graduation, he stayed home with his mother and farmed the home farm while his buddies were inducted into the army of World War II. To earn some extra money, he also drove the school bus.

Later Arthur married Sara Overturf. They were the parents of four children. Sara died of a heart attack in 1961. Later he was married to Lucille McKee Garrett. His family has grown to include ten grandchildren, one great-grandchild, two stepsons, one stepdaughter, ten step grandchildren, and six step great grandchildren.

Art and Lucille enjoy cookouts with their families, as well as trail rides on the mules with their friends. Arthur has tried his hand at many occupations, such as truck driving, carpentering, perma-stone siding, and running an oil station in Patterson. He also became a plasterer through an acquaintance of a Union plasterer, Augie Cooper from Leon. Augie believed in Art's ability, taught him the trade, and was not disappointed in Art.

In 1955 Arthur began working on the night shilft building tires for Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company. He worked there for 25 years, retiring at the age of 62.


After retirement, Art began enjoying some of his hobbies. He had hunted raccoon since he was 15, but retirement gave him time to really hunt in earnest. He bought good coonhounds and, of course, coonhunting called for --- "jumping mules." His careful choice of coonhounds and mules have won him many trophies.


Arthur is a member of Madison County Coon and Mule Association. He has no love for hunters who "jump the gun" on coon season. He has always been a nature lover. I remember one time, when he was a youngster, Art trying his hand at being a taxidermist. A squirrel was his first subject. He really didn't do too bad for not having the necessary materials to work with

Arthur has pitched horseshoes in state and national competition. In 1965(Art says it was 1954) he placed 5th in the Class A state tournament and was Senior State Champion in 1983. He has pitched at the Iowa State Fair for 36 years and has won over 70 trophies, several plaques, and many ribbons. He also has won many trophies with his mules and coonhounds.

At the age of 73(in 1992), Art can still pitch a pretty mean game of horseshoe. This year at the Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitching Association, he won first place in Class C. He is looking forward to pitching in the Madison County Fair and the Iowa State Fair.
