



The poem on the previous page is for the many IHHPA/NHPA members who attend the many tournaments that are held throughout the year. Tournament time is a time to spend with longtime friends and a time to make new friends. Avid horseshoe pitchers are no different than avid golfers or bowlers, etc. We do it because we like it. I have had some fun with Part One and Part Two and when it comes down to it, it makes little difference how you deliver the shoe and what your ringer average is. We know what a great sport it is, the question is, why is it that more people are not drawn into our game at the competition level? More directly, why are the competitive numbers of sanctioned pitchers going down? The NHPA needs to find the answers, the IHHPA needs to find the answers, and we as members of both organizations need to find the answers. We need positive thoughts, ideas, and direction. "We may be down in numbers but with everyone talking and doing positive things to further the sport of horseshoe pitching, we will increase participation at the organized level."

The IHHPA has implemented some good promotions and is continuously looking at new methods to try. The NHPA?, needs to do more. Why is it that we seldom read in the Newsline about what we are doing at the National level to try to bring our sport into the same level as bowling, golf, tennis, etc.??? It seems that this issue should be on the front burner and a concentrated effort from every NHPA officer should be their top number on priority. We all need to do more.

What would be wrong with each state association holding a brain-storming session with its elected officers and tournament directors. From these sessions the principal officer of each state would bring these collective ideas to a NHPA brainstorming meeting. Out of this session should come some directives and maybe we can see some action for a change. A typical idea that may just surface; The NHPA will try to find a sponsor to televise a World Tournament final game such as the one between Brian Simmons and Allan Francis. No sponsor? Then we the members foot the bill. Talk is cheap, everyone needs to do something. Think of this, invite a friend, neighbor, relative or fellow worker to meet you at the courts to learn the game of horseshoes. They may surprise you and accept your invitation. If they enjoy it and are interested, invite them to come with you to a tournament. While there, explain how the classes are comprised of pitchers within their skill level.

Leagues: I would bet that anyone contacting their cities Parks and Recreation Department would find a willing partner in recruiting individuals for a horseshoe league.

An interesting fact: How does the Iowa Sanctioned numbers compare with the surrounding states? (approximate totals from Nat Stat listings 6/16/02) Minnesota leads with 1,005 members, Missouri is next with 750, Illinois 450, Nebraska 222, Iowa 2011!! What does it cost to be a member? Minnesota – Adults \$22.00, Adults in same household \$17.00, Juniors free with Charter paying NHPA \$5.00. Missouri – Adults \$20.00, Juniors \$5.00. Illinois – Adults \$22.00 Juniors \$5.00. Nebraska – Eastern \$23.00, Western \$17.00 Juniors \$6.00. Iowa – Adults \$25.00 (includes cost of Newsletter) Second family member \$15.00 Juniors \$7.00. It appears that our dues are higher because we are not collecting as much money as Minnesota and Missouri due to lower memberships.

True story: I was in a meeting with the local Parks and Recreation making plans to present horseshoe pitching classes and it was to be advertised in their brochure they mail out to all residents. I was asked what amount of participation fee I would like to charge? I told them, nothing, that I wanted everyone to come and did not want a cost to keep them from coming. He said to me that that was OK but he had learned that when something is presented that is free the people think that it isn't going to be interesting because it didn't cost anything. If this is true maybe we need to increase the costs associated with our sport to be in line with other sports.

WE CANNOT SIT BACK AND WISH ABOUT INCREASING OUR MEMBERSHIP. ALL OF US SHOULD BE DOING SOMETHING ABOUT IT!!!!
