



Marvin Woollums was born to Clair and Zelma (Roberts) Woollums, on a farm north of Kellerton, Iowa in 1933. Marv went to school in Mt Ayr and graduated in 1951 from the Mt Ayr Community High School.

In 1953 he married Freida Lamb. Marv and Freida had three children, David, Marla and Brian, 5 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. This family lost Freida when she passed away in 1992.

Mary served in the Navy from 1955 until 1957 during the tail end of the Korean War.

Out of high school he went to work for the C B & Q railroad, working there until 1958 when he went to work for Iowa Southern Utilities(currently Alliant Energy). He started out as a lineman, later becoming a lineman foreman which job he held until retirement in 1996.

When not pitching horseshoes, Marv enjoys camping in his camper and fishing from his boat.

Mary remembers his father pitching horseshoes when he was a small child, but he didn't get interested until he got out of the Navy. He started pitching in 1958 and pitched until about 1978, then took a break and didn't pitch again until about 1987. He has been an active horseshoe pitcher since that time and enjoys every minute of it.

Marv has shown his support of the game by instructing the Mt Ayr High School, in the fine art of horseshoe pitching, twice and the Mt Ayr Junior High School, once. He has also helped Gary Reed at Stuart with horseshoe pitching. He felt the kids seemed interested and enjoyed learning.

In 1964, Mary remembers pitching in the Midland Open at St. Joe, Missouri. You had to pitch 100 shoes to qualify and he had a score of 256. This put him in Class A which was a 10 man class. Finishing 4th he felt good as he had pitched against some real good horseshoe pitchers. Such as Roland Craft, Kansas State Champion, Ray Caven, Missouri State Champion, Vogel from Illinois, Dale Dixon and John Paxton, both from Iowa and other good pitchers from Nebraska, Missouri and Iowa.

Mary has been Iowa State Champion three times. He is a big promoter of the game of horseshoes and a great sportsman. It is always a joy and an experience to play a game of horseshoes with him.

MINUTES OF 2002 IHHPA ANNUAL MEETING October 19, 2002

The 2002 IHHPA Annual Meeting was held on October 19, 2002 at 10:00 A.M. at the Moose Lodge in Marshalltown, IA. President Bob Walters began by thanking Bob and Marion Mc Kee for being the hosts. The meeting was then called to order. There were 58 people in attendance, 33 members and 25 guests. The Pledge of Allegiance was said. Danny Sease followed with a short prayer.

Secretary Russ Martin read the minutes of the previous meeting. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Leonard Mullnix and seconded by Ron Swartzendruber. The minutes were approved.

Russ Martin gave the Treasurers report.

1st Vice President, Dick Walker reported that the float only had one appearance this year. That was at the Veisha parade in Ames. He also explained some of the issues that are involved in using and storing the float. He proposed donating the float to the IHHPA. There was a brief discussion about accepting the donation and it was decided to have the Executive Committee make any decision in regard to the matter.

2nd Vice President, Danny Sease reported on the national bylaw change regarding the Newsline Magazine. He also gave a brief description of the duties of 2nd VP including handling the voting for the Frank Jackson and the Hall of Fame Awards.

3rd Vice President, Ronnie Burgess gave a report on activities and improvements in the Cedar Rapids area this year and thanked

everyone who helped him.

4th Vice President, Harold Garner described the duties of his office including the tournament schedule.

Regional Director Chair, Leo Buell was not present, but submitted a letter, which was read.

Delegate to the National Convention, Charles Phipps, was not present and submitted no report.

Regional Directors that were present reported on their respective districts. Jan Flemming indicated that tournament numbers as well as participation were down this year. Marvin Dirks talked about the Alta Tournament and the Clay County Fair. John Ridgely reported having several new people playing in non-sanctioned tournaments but not joining the association. He also gave a brief report on the Central Iowa Traveling Horseshoe League and the Wednesday Night league in Des Moines. Bob Walters read a letter from Stoney Jackson. Most notable was a report of increased participation. Bob then reported on upcoming Eldora tournaments. Phyllis Von Thun talked about the difficulty getting enough help to run a tournament. Russ Martin reported for Bob Block. He indicated that there may not be anymore tournaments in Sumner.

Dennis Smith gave the Youth Directors report. He related the same difficulty in getting participation but had some support in his area to help promote the sport.

Publicity Director Don Wilson reported that he still needs 11 photos of Hall of Fame members for the trailer. He also reported on the sanctioned and the non-sanctioned tournaments he held this year.

Mic Wilson thanked everyone that submitted items for the Newsletter. She also gave some suggestions for items and asked for any other ideas or suggestions.

Lois Garner announced her retirement from the statistician's job.

Danny Sease gave a report of activities at the Sate Fair this year. He said the memory book he compiled would be in the Hall of Fame trailer. He thanked LeRoy Law for all the work he had done as well as everyone who helped running the events and the exhibition. He also indicated that there would be some changes in the fair schedule next year.

Proposed Bylaws changes were then brought up. A proposal to correct a typographical error in the Constitution was passed by a show of hand.

A proposal to amend Bylaws Article VIII Sec. 2 was read. The amendment dealt with the flow of information between the statistician, the regional director and tournament directors and making sure tournament directors have the most current stats. The amendment passed on a 24 to 9 vote.

A proposal to amend Bylaws Article VIII Sec. 3 was read. This amendment added checking for current membership of participants to a tournament directors responsibilities and eliminates the need for a current and non-current member list. The amendment passed unanimously.

A proposal to amend Bylaws Article VI dealing with compensation for the statistician and the web page master failed by voice vote.

Under new business, the web page was discussed. It was determined that Phyliss Bruffett was to busy to keep the page current. Jan Warwick was nominated by Russ Martin to be the new Webmaster. Doug Anderson seconded. There were no other nominations. The vote to elect Jan was unanimous. Discussion of compensation for the position followed. A motion to pay the Webmaster \$100.00 was withdrawn after some discussion. Dave Sidles made a motion to pay a salary of \$200.00. The motion was seconded and passed.

Minutes (Con't.)

After a break for lunch, Ralph Palmer gave a humorous and insightful talk about life. He then served as auctioneer to sell several donated items.

Several year end awards were presented. Harold Garner presented Gerald Weeks with the Frank Jackson Award and spoke briefly about the nominee. Russ Martin presented the Sportsmanship Award to Leonard Mullnix. An Appreciation Award was presented to Don and Mic Wilson by Rollie and Phyllis Von Thun. Most Improved Player Award went to James Fortune. Bob Walters presented Danny Sease with the Presidents Award and also the Tournament Directors Award for his tremendous success at the State Fair.

Two new members were voted into the Hall of Fame this year. Betty Mc Gregor and Jan Flemming. Betty Mc Gregor was not present. Jan was presented his award by Danny Sease.

Dick Carlson spoke about the Iowa Games with a brief rundown of participation over the years. He also mentioned the positive response to the float in the Veisha parade.

LeRoy Law and Gary Reed took the podium to discuss targeting an age group of 40-65 year olds as the most likely source of new players. They suggested possible ways of getting information about horseshoes out to these people including flyers on various community bulletin boards.

The Farrell Foster Family Memorial was discussed briefly. It was decided to let the Executive Board deal with this matter. Election of officers followed. Dick Carlson was the only nominee for 2nd Vice President. A motion was made to close nominations. The motion passed and the vote was unanimous. Several nominees for 4th Vice President declined to accept. Harold Garner was re-elected. Russ Martin nominated Dave Sidles for Secretary/Treasurer. There were no other nominations. The vote was unanimous. Dave Sidles was also elected Statistician with no other nominations being made. There were also no new nominations for the positions of Publicity Director and Youth Director. Don Wilson and Dennis Smith were unanimously re-elected to those positions.

Election of officers was followed by a singing of God Bless America by everyone present.

David Sidles made a motion that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded and passed. The meeting was adjourned.





WANTED: HORSESHOE PITCHERS

This is a new and ongoing effort to advertise and present the sport of horseshoe as a legitimate sport to any one who seeks an outlet for their individual needs. If a person has been involved in other sports but has experienced some physical discomfort and can no longer participate-horseshoe pitching would be a logical sport to acquaint yourself with. Anyone who enjoys competition but over the years begins to experience movement problems - this is the sport that allows and challenges you to continue being young and competitive. Those who would benefit from such a sport come from various walks of life. Some of you have lost a spouse, now seeking fellowship. Some have moved to a different town or state and wish to establish new contacts and friendships. Some may be to advanced in years to continue participating in other sports.

Horseshoe sees people in their 60's, 70's, and 80's, participating against people decade's younger and WINNING consistently! The start up cost is embarrassingly CHEAP! The continuing cost is also embarrassingly CHEAP. \$50.00 will get you a tournament quality pair of horseshoes. The annual membership, accepted in any state, is \$25.00. You may wish to play in jeans and a comfortable shirt - fine. You may wish to wear shirt/trousers that portray your personality or your earned patches from winning your matches - fine. There are numerous tournaments, to many to mention, that are held in Iowa and all other states. Many town celebrations include horseshoe tournaments (4th of July, etc.). Vacationing players bring horseshoe pitchers together. There are literally thousands of opportunities to make new and serious friendships. The tournaments you elect to participate in will cost you from \$5.00 to \$10.00. Money and patches are awarded to the winhers and to those placing high. Horseshoe is a deceptively easy/difficult sport. For those of you who want the exercise, it's a walk in the park. For those of you who wish to become competitive, it is BOTH a physical and cerebral sport. Your competitive records are automatically kept for you and up to date at each tournament. They are also available on the net. You are never overmatched with the competition. If you are beginning you will be matched with those of equal ability. As you become more proficient you will be matched with those of equal ability. The sport runs through the winter because there are opportunities to play indoors. Your main and most expensive cost will be traveling to and from the various matches. This expense is more times than not reduced by car-pooling with other players. The commradre is GREAT! At each tournament you have time to continue the many friendships and you will look forward to doing so. At the tournaments you will be placed in a class according to your ringer percent. A typical match will consist of 5 games, 40 shoes per game. This computes to 200 shoes per match. A shoe weighs 2+ pounds so you're pitching (40X2X5) 400 pounds of steel per match. This plus walking and bending over is why doctors highly recommend the sport. The stakes are 40 foot apart. Players 70+ may pitch from 30 feet. Usually in August, states conduct state championships. Also in August a World Horseshoe Tournament is held in a designated state where over 1,000 will be in attendance. There you will find many Canadians and others from around the world. This sport encourages everyone, youth, men, women all ages, and also the handicapped. Yes this writer was beaten soundly by a young man in a WHEELCHAIR! At a World Tournament. Everyone gets beaten in this sport. This is where the cerebral part comes into play.

Keep checking this location monthly, as updates will follow. Individual players receive this communication each month from our association and copies of this letter are made and pinned up on various bulletin boards everywhere. This is our response to the ever increasing costs of advertising. The players of this organization are willing to do this to advance this fine sport. Iowa is divided into several regions. The person for you to contact in your region is shown below
