


Now that the weather has given us some sunshine, let's all get out and get back into the "horse-shoe pitching mode."

My name is Jim Gorth and I am the 5th Vice President of the Southern California Horseshoe Pitchers Association.

My mission with this letter is to inform you that we have submitted a bid to host the 2005 World Horseshoe Pitching Championships in Bakersfield, California. With the support and backing of the Bakersfield Convention and Visitors Bureau, we want to host the 2005 World Tournament and I am soliciting your help in gaining the support of your respective charters and delegates at the convention in Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

The tournament will be held at the Kern County Fair-grounds in Bakersfield. The venue will have 2 air conditioned buildings that will house a total of 48 courts and a 3rd building that will house all other NHPA staff and functions. There are some 200 RV sites with hookups right on the fairgrounds. Plenty of concession stands. 26 outdoor practice courts are within 3 miles of the fairgrounds. Hotels are in abundance in all price ranges.

Some of you may think it is a long way to come, but if you have ever considered taking a vacation to California, what better time than to do it in 2005. Bakersfield has so much to offer and is within ½ day or less driving distance to Sea World, San Diego Zoo, San Diego Wild Animal Park, Leggo Land, Disneyland, Knotts Berry Farm, Magic Mountain, Las Vegas, Pacific Ocean, Yosemite and the Sequoia National Forest. There is something to do for everone no matter what you enjoy. There is also a regional airport in Bakersfield that runs shuttle services to Los Angeles. 

PROFILE OF A PITCHER

Marion Lange was born in Greene County, Iowa on November 2, 1912. He has lived and farmed most of his life near Bondurant, Iowa, where he has the distinction of being called "Mr. Horseshoes." He and his wife, Pauline, are now retired and live in Ankeny, IA. (1990)

Marion has been a member of the NHPA since 1928 and has spent a lifetime of dedication to the support and promotion of the sport of horseshoe pitching. In 1924, at the age of 12, he started pitching horseshoes with his father with this bit of advice, "If you can't stand to get beat, don't get into horseshoes." Marion played in his first tournament in 1928 in Polk County, Iowa, and it was there that he pitched some with Frank Jackson, first World Champion from Kellerton, Iowa, who was a spectator at the meet. In 1945 he placed second in the Iowa State

Championship Class A and from 1945 to 1965 placed second, twice; third, three times; and in the top five many times. He won the Iowa State Farmers Championship in 1947 and 1949, also Iowa State Open Champion in 1970 and 1971. Marion participated in 4 "Class A" World Tournaments – 1946, 1954, 1957 and 1960; placing 16th in 1946 at Birdland Park in Des Moines, Iowa. In 1954 he defeated Ted Allen, World Champion, in the first round of play and finished in 24th place. In 1962 and 1964 he won the Four-State title (Ia., Mo., Ks., & Ne.) at Falls City, Ne. with a 75% ringer average. He had first high game of 88% at the Omaha Open.

Marion was President of the IHHPA in 1949, 1950, 1951 and 1952 and again in 1986 and 1987. In 1950 as president, he and Secretary Cunningham of the Iowa State Fair Association, signed a contract for the State Horseshoe tournament to be held at the Iowa State Fair in Des Moines, where it has remained since.

He was State Superintendent of Horseshoes from 1973 through 1982 and again in 1985, 1986 and 1987 and during his tenure State Fair entries went from 50 to 700. In 1982 he received and award from the Iowa State Fair Board for recognition of outstanding service to the Iowa State Fair.

Marion received the NHPA "Recognition and Achievement Award" at the World Tournament in Greeneville, OH in 1977. He was instrumental in negotiating Des Moines, Ia as the site for the 1978 World Tournament and was Co-Director of that event. Marion was inducted into the IHHPA "Hall of Fame" in 1978 at the State Fair. In 1982 he received the coveted IHHPA "Frank Jackson Award" for meritorious service.

Marion is a member of the Izaak Walton Chapter at Ankeny and in 1981 started promotion of horseshoe pitching at the club. They now have 12 good clay courts and two tournaments a year.

The highlight of Marion's career was when he was inducted into the NHPA "Hall of Fame" in the player — organizer category at the World Tournament in Spearfish, South Dakota in 1989. He also received a certificate of appreciation for 60 years contribution in promoting and supporting the sport of horseshoes by the NHPA in 1989 signed by Dave Loucks, President of the NHPA.

In his 62 years as an NHPA member, the friends he has made and the enjoyment that has been his as a result, Marion feels he can never repay, but will keep on trying.

Pauline, Marion's wife, has been most supportive in his horseshoes career and had this to say for her husband's hobby: "I told him I would put a pair of Horseshoes in his casket." Marion had this answer: "Better put in more than one pair, I might meet someone along the way to pitch with."

This was submitted by Bill Vandergriff in 1990. Marion now resides at the Mitchell Village Care Center in Mitchellville, Iowa. He lost his wife Pauline on February 1, 2003.

IN MEMORY

We were saddened to hear of the death of Pauline Lange, February 1, 2003. Pauline had suffered a stroke in October and a heart attack the week before she passed away. The funeral service was held Thursday, February 6th at the Capitol Hill Christian Church in Des Moines.

Pauline was the wife of Marion Lange, a great promoter of Horseshoes in Central Iowa. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Marion.

NOTICE TO TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS:

In complying to the change in the Constitution passed at the last annual meeting, the statistition will no longer send you tournament material. This function has been assigned to the (RD) Regional Director. The RD will send one sign in sheet, one summery sheet, one results sheet, one sheet of applications, NHPA patches and sanction certificate. You will have to make copies of these sheets as necessary. If you have more than one tournament, make enough copies for all. The RD will not send percentage sheets to any tournament director who has access to the internet. Percentages for every member in the State may be obtained from the NHPA web site.

Any tournament director who doesn't have access to the internet and wishes that the stats be sent to him or her will have to request it from the RD two weeks in advance of the tournament. Patches and sanction certificate will be sent for each and every tournament. There will not be a current or non-current membership list as in the past. It is the duty of the tournament director to check each and every contestant for current membership. Also send tournament results to the Statistician/Secretary and the Newsletter editor within 7 days after your tournament. When results reach the NHPA Natstats and if every person is not a member of the NHPA, the whole tournament results will be thrown out.





It's Saturday night, March 1st, and I just came back from Liberty, Mo. Where Carl Kaiser, Marv Woollums and I pitched in the new Harris Arena indoor courts. 10 courts with the clay in the floor, stakes 7 ft. long into the ground. (don't ask me how they got them all straight with the exact angle but they did.) White backstops with the stakes unpainted giving an opposite color contrast. Kind of hard to get used to but it works for them.

The setup is similar to Eldora with the stakes the same distance from one wall. Their ceiling doesn't seem as high as Eldora, but it may be because they have a heating element running the length of the courts on both sides. The clay is Kentucky blue and is very nice with no dust visible. I believe it is because its not up like the portables. The clay needs little water during play. I was told they water after play around the edges and it absorbs real good. (no place for it to go) The consistency seems to be the same over the entire surface. Probably the best that I have played on. When you walk in you see a 6 to 8 ft. chain link fence. (kind of a caged in feeling at first until you get used to it, very safe). A little above the fence on each court is a computer and monitor. Each scorekeeper controls the computer on his/her court along with the manual regulation hand scoresheet. The computer could be used by itself but they are afraid of a power outage occurring. (happened once to them) I used the computer for one game, assisted by the regulation scorekeeper. The monitor takes the place of our scoreboards. The players, when at the end, can look at the monitor (very large font) and see the score, number of shoes pitched, and a running inning to inning account of what their average is (changes whenever the scorekeeper enters results of each inning pitched.) When the player calls out results, the scorekeeper first presses the number of ringers (both players total = 2 dead, 3 ringers 3, 4 dead. Then the score = 3 ringers 3 would be = press 3. Then two keys are designated A and B (A player – B player) that the scorekeeper hits for the player calling out the score. The computer does the rest and the scorekeeper can check his sheet with the screen. If an error is made you simply hit E and that inning is erased and you re-enter the right ones.

It works really well and was easy to pick up, even me. 10 monitors and computers were donated to them from Sprint. They use ten and gave the others to another club. The people were very nice and it was an enjoyable trip. I played in a 7 player A class, and was doing pretty good even won one game. Averaged over 50% for the first 5 games then pitched my 30% game (you could say I went in the tank.)

This is a very nice facility that the pitchers in Missouri can be proud of.


