
I want to take this opportunity to thank Don and Mic Wilson for all they have done as President and Newsletter Editor. I congratulate them on jobs well done.

# Minutes of the 2005 IHHPA Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association was held on October 22, 2005 at the Moose Lodge in Marshalltown, Iowa.

President Don Wilson called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

IHHPA Chaplain, Glenn Warden opened the meeting with a prayer, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. 51 people were in attendance, which included 41 IHHPA members.

Secretary/Treasurer Dave Sidles read the minutes of the previous meeting. They were approved as read. He then gave a treasurer's report indicating the following: The current bank balance as of 10/20/2005 was \$2342.27. Factoring in extraordinary income and expenses the IHHPA had a net profit for the fiscal year of \$67.05. Extraordinary items included \$671.00 of additional expense for the Hall of Fame trailer, Memorial funds received from the family of Kenneth Clark in the amount of \$280.00, a donation of \$100.00 from Joe Dolter, \$479.00 raised at the WDM Fundraiser tournament put on by Leroy Law, and \$100.00 of IHHPA salaries returned to the association by both Dave Sidles and Jan Warwick. As of 9/30/2005 the investment account balance was \$5826.50. A total of 18 newsletter ads were sold in 2005. Membership for the year totaled 249, which was a decline of 13 from the previous year.

Regional Director Leo Buell expressed the need to continue to try to sell more newsletter advertising. He indicated that currently the NW region was without a director since Mel and Opal Harms had moved to California. He also indicated that Bob Block was not as active in the NE region. Mary Dirks reported on the WC region. He said there were no leagues in the region this year and that work on new Spencer courts had stopped for now. He said he would try to get an update on the Spencer courts in January. Marv said he would like to see more Iowans participating in the World Tournament. He spoke briefly of his trip to the Bakersfield tournament and finishing 6<sup>th</sup>. Mary Engstler pointed out that regional directors were asked to submit a report to the newsletter prior to annual meeting and that only he did. As indicated in his report, there had been several non-sanctioned tournaments in his region. He also said that he would like to see the state champions receive their awards at the annual meeting. Central region Director, Doug Anderson, reported that the court he helped built at the retirement facility in his area was apparently not being used. He said that the two tournaments held in Boone this year were well attended and that there is a possibility of getting the lights working there for possible future use. He also suggested inviting an area radio celebrity to a tournament and broadcasting it on air. EC regional director Leonard Mullnix reported having a good tournament in Dubuque at which several door prizes were given away. He said new courts had been built in Dubuque. He reported that Cedar Rapids continued to host well attended tournaments and the Larry Purcell was also running a sanctioned league there. Leonard thought that Clinton might not hold another tournament because of poor turnout. Stoney Jackson confirmed poor attendance at his tournaments but that he would still try to have some. He did say that an indoor tournament held in Grandview on rubber mats was a success. Stoney again raised the question of declining participation in the sport. SC director Steve Hatch was not present. Dave Sidles reported for the DM/Ankeny region. He said that the Central Iowa Traveling Horseshoe League had another successful year with an increase in participation. He reported that the Iowa Games would continue in Ames with a change to hi-lo doubles for the Friday event. The senior event was dropped because of the limited number of players. Jan Fleming reported that there little change in participation in the SW region. Vern McGrath displayed pictures of the new facility in Dubuque and described the league activities there. Dave Sidles asked why they weren't sanctioned and Vern indicated that beer drinking during play was the reason.

Leo Buell indicated that 60 sanctioned tournaments were held in Iowa with 20 of those being held indoors at Eldora. He thanked Leroy for the work he did on the schedule.

Reports from the association officers the next item on the agenda. 1st Vice President, Glenn Warden said that as chaplain, he was only contacted about 3 times by members wanting to discuss IHHPA or personal issues. He indicated that he would like to see better facilities in Iowa for pitching and that members be more involved in helping do the work necessary to make a tournament happen. He suggested advertising tournaments in local newspapers. Ronnie Burgess brought up the point as to what purpose the ads should try to serve, to get more players or spectators. Glenn suggested having 50/50 drawings at all tournaments to cover the cost of the ads. 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Dick Carlson expressed concern over the average age of the IHHPA membership. He said that he was attempting to compile information on membership in the IHHPA as far back as he could. He thanked everyone that helped with the Iowa Games again this year. Don Wilson said he would like to see more IHHPA members participating in the Iowa Games. 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President Mike Fishnick reported that he had attended the delegates meeting at the World Tournament. He followed up on Glenn's suggestion to advertise events and indicated that they do that in Dubuque. 4th Vice President Leroy Law thanked all the tournament directors for helping make sure everyone got a date for their tournament. He expressed his concerns about declining membership. He indicated that leagues might be good avenue to get new members. He spoke to the idea that many non-sanctioned leagues remained that way so they could have alcohol at the site. Ronnie Burgess suggested having church leagues. Dave Sidles reported that he had spoken to Jan Warwick about web site content and possible improvements. He then expressed concern that 2 tournaments remained unreported because results were never turned in. He also reiterated that tournament directors need to make sure everyone has a current membership or pays for one at the tournament. Bob Walters reported for the Eldora Club saying that the ads they put in the local paper are free public service ads. He said he had attended a tournament in Waverly on portable courts in which 25 non-sanctioned players attended. It was the first time in 12 years that such an event had taken place. Bob suggested every current member try to get 1 new person to join this year.

Following a recess for lunch, Don Wilson put forth a motion to form a committee to rewrite the IHHPA By-Laws. The motion was seconded and passed. Leroy Law agreed to head up the committee that would also include Dick Carlson, Danny Sease and Dave Sidles.

Leo Buell took the floor to present a proposal to host the 2009 World Tournament in Cedar Rapids. He said that he was joined by Larry Purcell and Ralph Palmer to explore suitable locations for the event. It was determined that the best site would be the new Ice Arena. Representatives of the Ice Arena and the CVB then gave a presentation and handed out information folders to everyone. They answered questions and described the CVB's commitment to the IHHPA and the WT. Leo read a letter from Ralph Palmer indicating his support for the attempt to the secure the WT in Cedar Rapids. A vote of the members present at the meeting showed support to continue with the bid process.

Year-end awards were presented next. Dave Sidles and Dick Carlson each received the Presidents award for their years of dedication to the Iowa Games horseshoe event.

The most improved player award went to Alan Duffy of Dubuque. Carl Kaiser was the recipient of the inaugural Player of the Year award. Bob and Marion McKee were recognized for their efforts with the indoor tournaments in Eldora by together receiving the Frank Jackson award. Bob also received the tournament director of the year award.

C Leo Buell and Bernard Ricker were induced into the IHHPA Hall of Fame. Mr. Ricker lives in Mt. Ayr and was unable to attend the ceremony. Dick Carlson said he would personally deliver the plaque him within the next week.

Danny Sease presented the only bid to host the 2006 State Tournament. The location would be the Iowa State Fairgrounds courts and the event would again take place during the Iowa State Fair. He read a letter that was sent the fair board with several suggestions for improvements to the court facility. He said that the 2005 events were a success. Danny expressed disappointment in the Des Moines Register for sporadically publishing daily results. It was moved and seconded that the IHHPA accept the bid. The motion passed.

Election of officers was next. All offices up for election received only one nomination and all candidates were elected by acclamation. Those persons elected were as follows:

President - Leroy Law

1<sup>st</sup> Vice President – Glenn Warden

3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President – Mike Fishnick

Regional Director - C Leo Buell

With Leroy Law moving to President, nominations for the now vacant 4<sup>th</sup> VP position were opened. Connie Moore received the only nomination and was elected.

Mic Wilson said that she had spoken to Debbie Davis about the position of newsletter editor and that Debbie had agreed to accept the position. She was then nominated and elected by voice vote. Debbie was not present at the meeting.

A drawing for several door prizes was held with Steve Jackson winning the free IHHPA membership for the second year in a row.

A motion was made to have the 2006 meeting at the Moose Lodge in Marshalltown. The motion was passed. A motion to adjourn the meeting was passed. The meeting was adjourned at 3:00 p.m.

If we should ever go back to points per shoe instead of ringer percentage, it will have originated from Don. He firmly believed that should be the way to go.

Don had a handicap formula second to none. He claimed to have had every single score card he ever had. I can't hang onto mine till I get home. He kept our books for league and they go back for 20 years. For instance, we could ask him our results for May 1992 and he could give it to you.

For years he had given us a yearly report, even as to miles walked and tons of steel pitched. The only thing that he was missing was calories burnt per 100 shoes pitched.

Don was a great sport. If you were looking at the stake to see your points and a pretty girl rode by on the bike trail, you could enjoy the look while Don gave you your points and you knew you got what you had coming and more. Whenever there was a discrepancy of any kind, Don was right in the middle of it, and it was solved very fairly.

Thank everyone for signing his card at the annual meeting. He really got a thrill from that card.

I am so glad that I called him the night before he died. He sounded good and said he was taking some new pills that cost \$12.00 a piece and he really thought he was on the climb, but the next morning at 4 a.m., he was gone. I am sure that when he said good-bye that he had no idea of the size of the void he was leaving.

# The Ancient Game of Horseshoes

s early as the second century, before the Christian era, iron plates or rings for shoes were nailed on horses' feet in Western Asia and Eastern Europe.

The origin horseshoe pitching thought to have begun in Greece and Rome as Quoits objects, tossed at two stakes projecting one inch from the ground and located eighteen feet apart. Quaits was very popular in the 17th in this country in Colonial times. But in time horseshoe pitching became the more popular of the two games.

Up until the early



Records, the first World Bronson, Kansas, in 1909. The record for men's titles (one they say will never be proken) is 10 by Ted Allen, of Boulder, Colorado. In 1951, Allen threw 72 consecutive ringers in a single game. However, the most ringers in a single game is 175 by Glen Henton, of Maquoketa, Lowa, in 1965.

Today, interest in the game is reviving. It would not be surprising to see horseshoe tournaments on ESPN just like billiards or beach volley ball as a the regular television feature.

Bill was a member of NHPA for 25 years, and served as an NHPA Regional Director. He was also a past President and Vice President of the IHHPA.

Survivors include his wife, Ruth, of Fairfield; two daughters, Gloria Carol Honea and husband Brian of Dallas, Texas; Gayle Gilpin of Fairfield; and a son, Neil Vandegriff and wife Trudy of Fairfield.
