

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

IHHPA MEMBERS TOURNAMENT PARTICIPATION MAY BE THE HIGHEST IN THE NHPA !!!

Using the latest NHPA adult membership information (1979 – 2004) available and tournament participation taken from NHPA Nat Stats. The Iowa statistics are both good and bad. To give you some background I have listed here figures that represent how we compare with States bordering Iowa.

Minnesota 959	1,130 in 2000
Missouri 824	1,103 in 1993
Wisconsin487	487 in 2004
Illinois 445	659 in 1991
<u>Iowa</u> <u>245</u>	455 in 1991
So Dakota 98	234 in 1989
(NHPA12,663)	(14,844 in 1991)

Nat Stats shows Iowa with 215 tournament participants. Adding up the number that members have played in tournaments shows <u>1,460</u> with a member Participation average of <u>6.79!!!!</u> This average is far greater than most, if not all, bordering States.

It will be a challenge for all of us to increase our adult and junior membership. I am confident that we will make substantial gains this year if we actively work at doing so.

In this Newsletter you will find an insert that I feel will help you find new members in your area. It contains everything a prospective horseshoe pitcher needs to know. This will give you a tool to bring new members into the IHHPA. When practicing at the courts and playing in tournaments how many times have individuals approached you asking questions? Now, instead of just voice information, you can follow up by reaching into your Horseshoe box/bag and give them a copy of this insert. It is proven that when a person is told information, only a small percentage is retained. This is what I am asking you to do: Make at least ten copies and also the same number of tournament schedules. Have them with your horseshoes and in your car.. Give these to prospective pitchers.

Also place them in your Parks and Rec offices, Libraries, Senior Citizen Centers, Boy/Girl Scout organizations, schools, the list goes on and on.

Will it work ?? I think so. Can I count on you to do this ?? I believe so.

IOWA HAWKEYE HORSESHOE PITCHERS ASSOCIATION

Interested in the sport of Horseshoe Pitching ???? You may be a beginner or someone who is familiar with the Game. If so, the following is for you.

You may not be aware that there is organized Horseshoe Pitching throughout the State of Iowa and in the United States and Canada. It was recently estimated that there are over 15 million horseshoe pitching enthusiasts. Each State Association is affiliated with the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association (NHPA). In Iowa the State association is the (IHHPA) "Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association". Do you have to belong to the Association to participate in organized Horseshoe pitching?? Not necessarily. There are both Sanctioned and Non - Sanctioned Tournaments and Leagues throughout the State. To participate in IHHPA Sanctioned events one has to be an IHHPA member for that current year. The yearly membership dues are \$25.00 (a second household members dues would be \$15.00) Junior (18 and under) membership Dues is \$7.00. (Junior membership in 2006 will be paid by the IHHPA.) This entitles the member to pitch in every tournament listed in the attached Schedule. Sanctioned tournament entry fees are generally \$10.00. Prize money is awarded to the first 3 or 4 places in a 6 player Class.

In August, at the Iowa State Fair, the IHHPA State Championships are held on the two week ends. There is horseshoe pitching during the eleven days of the Fair and many of the events are Non – Sanctioned. Heard most often is the statement; "I can't pitch horseshoes like they do at the Fair. Why they throw ringers every time. "Not True. No one pitches ringers every time and the format is that each pitcher competes with other players of comparable ability. The Newcomers and beginners enjoy the friendly competition as much as anyone else. You will find that each IHHPA member is friendly and will be more than willing to help you get started.

Check out the attached schedule and join us at a tournament or league near you.

Horseshoe Pitching Is A Fun Activity You Can Enjoy A Lifetime Join Us In This Friendly Competitive Sport

To help you understand how tournaments are conducted, here are a few answers to questions often asked.

- ➤ Players participate in Classes with players of near equal ability. This is determined by the player's ringer percentage.
- > The number of player's in a Class may vary. Usually there are six to a Class.
- ➤ Games are played to either a predetermined number of shoes or points. Usually 40 points or 50 shoes.
- ➤ While there can be pre registered tournaments, most tournaments begin at 10:00 A.M. and the sign in deadline is 9:30 A.M. First time pitchers should arrive by 9:00 A.M. to pitch 100 shoes to establish their ringer percentage for that day's tournament.
- > Tournament entry fee is usually around \$10.00.
- ➤ Game scorekeepers are paid .50 cents a game. Some tournaments include the scorekeeping amount with the entry fee.
- ➤ Players win prize money or trophies in each Class. Prize money determined by the number of players in the Class. Example: six player Class may pay first, second, third, and forth.
- Tournament Directors forward each players results (number of shoe's pitched, and number of ringers pitched) to the State Statistician who forward's this information to the NHPA Nat Stats Statistician that updates the players tournament record. The State Nat Stat sheet, showing all players and their current ringer average, is then available and is used at the next tournament the player participates in. This is available at the NHPA Web Site. (horseshoepitching.com)
- Also available on the NHPA Web Site is a vast amount of information Including Official Rules, pitching instruction, court construction and more. From there go to the Iowa Charter link for State information including the tournament pitching schedule.
- ➤ Playing in a League: There are many leagues around the state, some require membership in the IHHPA and some do not. If you would like To join a league contact an Officer listed on other side, or contact:

In memory of

MARLS B. GOODRICH

April 24, 1913 - February 6, 2006

Marls B. Goodrich passed away February 6, 2006 in Springfield, Missouri. He was born April 24, 193, near Adaville, Iowa.

Marls started pitching horseshoes in 1929 at the age of 16. When he was inducted into the IHHPA Hall of Fame in 2001, he had been pitching for 72 years. He was one of the top players in the Sioux Valley Horseshoe League for over 40 years and his team won first place many times. He played at the Plymouth County Fair in singles, doubles and point tournaments and holds the record for the highest score ever pitched in Plymouth County. He had 42 ringers out of 50 shoes (84%), 18 doubles and 8 single points, for 134 total points.

Marls also played at the Clay County Fair in Spencer, Iowa. In the IHHPA nomination paper, Marls said that he, George Englemann and Leon (Doc) Rodda got horseshoes started at the Spencer Fair in 1965. In the first few years at the Spencer Fair, the entry fee was \$1.00 per 100 shoes pitched and the high score for the day in each class would be the winner for the day. Marls scored 233 points out of 100 shoes.

When Marls started pitching at the Iowa State Fair, the courts were down by the livestock barns and occasionally they would play in the sheep barn. In 1979 he placed second in the State Championship Class. In 1985 and 1986, he was the Champion in the ladder flight. In 1990, he was Iowa State Farmers Champion and in 1991, he and Chet Fositer were Iowa State Doubles Champions.

When the World Tournament was in Des Moines, Marls qualified to play in Class A by getting 445 points out of 200 shoes. Although he didn't win first place that year, Marls played many of the top players and beat quite a few of them.

Marls retired in 1976 and started going to Bradenton, Florida in 1977. He played in two leagues during the winter months. Retreat, a local church near Bradenton, asked Marls to help put in regulation courts. Marls furnished all the material and traveled over 100 miles to get clay at \$55.00 per ton. After the first four courts were put in, Marls started promoting horseshoe tournaments at Christian Retreat. There was no entry fee, the food was free, and Marls put up \$200 for the prize money. After a few years, the tournament outgrew the four courts and Marls moved it to Bradenton. He continued to host the tournament each year and donated the prize money. In 2000, he received an award from the Bradenton Horseshoe Club in appreciation of his hosting the tournament for more than 20 years.

Marls also promoted and helped with the horseshoe tournaments at the LeMars County Fair. At the age of 80, he helped move the courts and furnished all the heavy angle iron for the backstops, cutting all 36 of them by hand with a hacksaw. He also furnished all of the material and with the help of his brother-in-law, Jule Bares, put in the walk-ways for 30-foot pitchers. In July, 2001, the LeMars Horseshoe Club nominated Marls for the IHHPA Hall of Fame. He was inducted that same year.

When he was a 40-foot pitcher, Marls threw several 60% to 70% games. He played in the World Tournaments as a Senior at 40 feet and won three times out of five.

In his 2001 nomination paper, Marls said he wanted to pitch until he was 90. He thanked the Good Lord for giving him the strength and ability to play horseshoes for 72 years.

Marls Goodrich was preceded in death by his wife, Burnace H. Hamilton. He is survived by two daughters and their husbands, Linda and Dr. Richard Honderick of Springfield, Missouri, and Kathie and the Rev. Lee Crum of Sioux City. Memorials in his name may be directed to his church, First Assembly of God in Sioux City.

Bob Walters strikes gold in IA Games


Veteran horseshoe pitching enthusiasts Bob Walters of Eldora captured one of the eight gold medals awarded during the Winter Iowa Games held recently.


