NHPA BUSINESS MEETING:

The meeting was held Sunday morning the 16th. Iowa's three Delegates were present along with 127 other Delegates. Jerry Labrosse from Minnesota was elected the 4th Vice president replacing Bonnie Seibolt, the long time incumbent.

After a lengthy discussion the proposed new rules rewrite was voted on. The vote was overwhelmingly in favor of the new RGS Book (Rules, Guidelines, Specifications) that will replace the old green rules pamphlet. While the new RGS Book is quite extensive and covers most everything, it was explained prior to the vote that changes could be made at next year's meeting, and Delegates were asked to submit such changes that they felt were needed.

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE:

On June 2nd I received notification that Dave Sidles. our Secretary Treasurer and Statistician, will be moving to Omaha, Nebraska sometime in the next three months. Dave has devoted many hours serving the IHHPA in a manner that exemplifies a degree of excellence that will be hard to replace. We certainly wish him and his family the best in his transition to his new location. The Executive Board will be making a decision to name a new Secretary/Treasurer and Statistician in the near future. That person, or persons, will have the opportunity to spend time with Dave to allow a smooth transition to these positions. While Dave handled both the Secretary/Treasurer position and the Statistician position, I think it might be best to see the two positions filled by two individuals as was filled previously. If you would like to be considered for either of these two positions, please contact me.

A final decision to bid on the World Tournament for 2009 in Cedar Rapids has not been made as of now.

Several of our court facilities have been upgraded or in the process now. Along with the extensive upgrading in Dubuque, Iowa City has made major improvements also. Additional 30 foot concrete platforms have been added in Marshalltown so that all have 30-foot platforms now. On behalf of all the horseshoe pitchers, a big thank you goes out to those responsible for these improvements.

I want to thank everyone who has been actively seeking out new members. If everybody works at this, we can present to others what all of us enjoy, <u>THE WONDERFULL SPORT OF HORSESHOE PITCHING.</u>

The Volunteer State Open Horseshoe Tournament, Crossville, Tennessee, drew 320 entrants with a prize fund in the neighborhood of \$75,000. This is the first tournament that acquired major sponsorship of this magnitude. The complete results can be found on the NHPA web site. First place in the Championship 40 foot men and the mixed 30 foot Championship Class paid the winners \$7,000 each. 2nd \$4,500; 3rd \$ 2,500; 4th \$1.500; 5th \$ 1,000 (12 player classes). Alan Francis won the 40-foot men Championship and Sue Snyder won the 30-foot Championship. The following is a report posted on the NHPA web site by another pitcher who watched Alan Francis and Brian Simmons play the deciding match:

They started with 4 fourdeads in a row, and Brian scored on two that bounced off on Alan. Actually, the early part of the game saw the guys score mostly because of bouncing shoes than real misses. After 6-6 Alan started to escape I think up to 18-6. At that point (probably more than 40 shoes) he had not missed as Brian scored on two that bounced off. Considering Alan also started (and finished) his previous game with 39 out of 40, this is absolutely amazing! The game lasted 100 shoes with 89 for Alan and 84 by Brian who, with 4 or 5 ringers lost, was just as amazing as Alan! "

Tournaments with this kind of prize money and number of participants can only increase the interest in the sport of horseshoe pitching. If they can do it in Tennessee, other states could do it also. Who knows? Maybe it could happen in Iowa!!.

NHPA HALL OF FAME

The NHPA Hall of Fame, Museum and horseshoe pitching facility will be built in 2006 on a three-acre site in Quail Ridge Park, St. Charles County, Missouri. Outside there will be an additional eight courts.

The sale of 65 acres of land and buildings has made it possible to rebuild the Hall of Fame in St. Charles. After Mr. Freeman passed away, there were few people to maintain and run the facility in Joelton. The New Melle Club in St. Charles is 200 members strong and they have agreed to oversee and run the operation.



City tosses a ringer

New courts a hit with pitchers

Betty Fishnick welcomed players from all over the state with a warm smile and the offer of a hot sandwich and a cold drink at a very reasonable price.

"It takes a lot of work to put one of these on, but it's worth it," says Fishnick, who spent the better part of the week getting food ready. "You see a lot of the same faces every time you go to one of these, and you want to make sure you do a good job."

Saturday's event drew rave reviews because of the reno-

vated courts located in the middle of the park: The Leisure Services Department installed a new lighting system, fences, dirt boxes and pavement while expanding the area from 10 to 12 courts.

These are really nice, and they put us on par with the courts in Cedar Rapids and Iowa City and Marshalltown, which are really, really nice," said Vern McGrath, who coordinated Saturday's tournament along with Mike. Fishnick Sr. "These are nice and level, and they're a lot easier to walk across because of the cement.

"The city really did a great job in getting these done. Although, they didn't help my game at all today."

McGrath lost all five of his matches in the F Division.

It took five years for the new horseshoe pitching courts to make it on the city's to-do list. They opened this spring for league play, but Dubuque Leisure Service manager Gil Spence waited until Saturday's showcase event for a ribbon-cutting caremony.

The tournament included eight divisions — A through H—based on pitchers' previous ringer percentage and attracted former state champlons from Iowa; Illinois and Wisconsin. It ran from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., with the Fishnick family smack dab in the middle.

Mike Fishnick Sr. competed in the tournament with his son, Mike Jr., and grandsons Alan and Nathan Duffy. Betty took care of the food, and her two daughters entered the results on scoresheets.

"It's pretty neat, because it's something the whole family can get involved with and it brings us closer together," said Mike Sr., who posted a 5-2 record and finished second in the B Division. "We have a lot of funwith it, and it's neat to pass the game on to our kids and grandkids. The whole family looks forward to this, and

we're planning to go to the world tournament in Wyoming this summer."

The Duffy boys represent the future of a sport populated mostly by the older generations. Local enthusiasts hope to someday introduce the sport to youngsters through physical education classes in the schools.

"My grandpa and my uncle got me into it, and I'm glad they did because it's a lot of fun," said Alan Duffy, 14. "There are some really good guys here, and they're always willing to give you tips to help you get better at it."

Pitchers throw from 40 feet, although the older competitors may move up 10 feet if they choose. Their horse-shoes have a three-inch opening, and the stake at each end measures one inch thick. Each pitcher in a head-to-head match throws up to 50 shoes.


In fact, about a dozen horseshoe players were on hand Thursday night for the weekly games organized by Warden, who moved to Mitchellville in October.
