

# NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE IHHPA CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

The IHHPA Annual Business Meeting will be held Sat. October 21<sup>st</sup>. 2006 at the Moose Lodge, 1516 Olive St. Marshalltown, Iowa. Meeting to begin at 10:00 A.M. The following Constitution and Bylaw amendments will be placed before the current members in attendance for their acceptance or rejection:

# Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association CONSTITUTION

# ARTICLE 1 (NAME)

Present Language: The name of this organization shall be the "Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association".

Add the following as a second sentence: Iowa Division of the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association.

Reason: NHPA Bylaws state that Charters be known as this.

# ARTICLE 3 (PURPOSES AND POWERS)

Insert the word form that was missing:

The purpose of this association shall be to provide an orderly means for its members to participate in and enjoy the game of horseshoe pitching. To encourage interested parties in organizing local clubs, leagues, or to form other groups for participation in horseshoe pitching \_ \_ \_ ( The rest of paragraph is unchanged. )

# ARTICLE 4 (AFFILIATION)

Remove existing language and replace with new language:

Present Language: The association must cooperate with the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America. This Organization may accept charters or authorizations for cooperation with any national or area organization and be entitled to conduct sanctioned and non-sanctioned tournaments and championships within the boundaries of its jurisdiction as provided for in the constitution and by-laws of this organization it represents or subscribes to through membership.

Replace with this language: The Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association (IHHPA) shall affiliate with and cooperate with the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association (NHPA). All matters not expressed in the IHHPA Constitution and By-Laws will be governed by the NHPA Constitution and By-Laws. The Official Playing Rules of the NHPA shall govern all IHHPA sanctioned events.

Reason: Present language contains unnecessary wording.

## ARTICLE 9 ( VOTING RIGHTS )

Remove this wording that repeats itself in present language. On each matter submitted to a vote.

# ARTICLE 12 (AMENDMENTS)

Add a second sentence to present language: This Constitution and by – laws may be changed, altered or amended in any lawfully called and properly assembled meeting of the association membership only by the affirmative vote of the members present by a two-thirds (2/3) majority.

Insert second sentence: Notice of proposed amendments shall be printed in the IHHPA Newsletter distributed the month prior to the scheduled Annual Meeting of the membership.

Reason: Roberts Rules of Order states that provisions for By-Law amendments should require previous notice to its members.

# ARTICLE 2 (ANNUAL MEETING)

# SECTION 4 ( NOTICE OF MEETING )

Add the following sentence to the present language as another means of (Notice of Meeting): An acceptable notice could also be printed in the IHHPA Newsletter.

Reason: All IHHPA members receive the Newsletter.

# ARTICLE 3 (EXECUTIVE COUNCIL)

# SECTION 4 (NOTICE)

Insert the following in parenthesis following "telephone" (including E - Mail,)

Reason: Adds another option for communicating a notice of any special meeting.

# ARTICLE 4 (OFFICERS)

# Section 6 (VICE PRESIDENTS)

Insert a comma after the word " act " in the first sentence.

# ARTICLE 7 (STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS)

## SECTION 1 (QUALIFICATIONS)

The first sentence now reads: All entrants to the State Championships must be members of both State and National Associations. Delete the remainder of present language and insert the following: Adult pitchers will be placed into the tournament according to their

NatStats ringer percent average at the close of a twelve (12) month entry window. Their NatStats record most show participation in a minimum of three (3) sanctioned tournaments during this period. A sanctioned league participant pitching a minimum of 400 shoes will be credited as pitching one (1) tournament. A sanctioned league participant pitching a minimum of 800 shoes will be credited as pitching two (2) tournaments. A sanctioned league participant pitching 1200 shoes will be credited with three (3) tournaments meeting the three-tournament requirement. Junior pitchers require one sanctioned average during the same period. Junior pitchers will also be deemed eligible by submitting with their entry form, a score sheet (scored and signed by a NHPA member) showing one hundred (100) shoes pitched and number of ringers scored.

Reason: With the introduction of NatStats as a source to track and make statistics available to regular tournament directors, our committee endorses this source as the method determining State tournament averages and number of tournaments played in a 12 month window. Recognizing that sanctioned league members establish their league average pitching a large number of shoes and attend weekly a substantial number of league sessions, it is important that this is taken into consideration giving them this credit. The addition of the junior language will allow juniors who have a vast amount of school activities and entertainment choices, who find it hard to attend sanctioned events, to be able to enter and play in the state tournament.

# ARTICLE 7 (STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS)

# SECTION 3 (DEADLINE)

Delete the present language: Deadline for entries into the men's division of State Championships is ten (10) days prior to the start of the State Championship dates.

Insert the following new language:

The deadline for entry into the State Championships will be the date seventeen (17) days before the state championships are scheduled to be held. From this Deadline date to the previous years Deadline date will be the entry window to establish the contestants ringer percentage and number of tournaments required.

Reason: This will improve and establish a consistent deadline date that will allow a timely period for the Classes to be formulated and playing schedule, date and time mailed to those entered.

# ARTICLE 7 (STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS)

## SECTION 6 (DATE)

Present wording: State tournament scheduled dates shall not conflict with the World Tournament.

Add to the start of this sentence: If unavoidable, the

Reason: World Tournament and the State tournament dates being held at the State Fairgrounds have been in conflict.

# ARTICLE 7 (STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS)

# SECTION 8 (GUIDELINES)

All play during the State Tournament will be under the guidelines of the association.

Replace the word association. insert: IHHPA in its place.

Reason: Identifies the association.

Insert a second sentence: All State Tournament Divisions shall use assigned individual scorekeepers and sessions (all classes) must have all scorekeeper chairs filled before play can begin on the courts.

Reason: All championship games need scorekeepers to avoid the distraction that players experience if they have to keep their own score. Filling all chairs before play can begin has been found to be effective in obtaining scorekeepers at the World Tournament and should be effective at the State Tournament level.

# ARTICLE 8 (TOURNAMENT RULES)

### SECTION 1

Remove existing language: Whenever possible ringer percentage shall be kept for all players in a tournament. When scorekeepers are being used, all classes must have scorekeepers. All players are encouraged to keep score when not pitching.

Replace with the following: All sanctioned tournaments must use a scorekeeping method that will involve determining the number of shoes pitched and the number of ringers pitched. Individual scorekeepers are preferred and all players are encouraged to keep score when not pitching. Tournament Directors must report the tournament results to the State Statistician immediately following the tournament. The State Statistician must then report the statistics to the NHPA NatStat contact person.

Reason: New language states that determining ringer percentages must be determined in a tournament. By stating "scorekeeping method "it is recognized that some tournaments do not use individual scorekeepers and have other methods to keep track of shoes and ringers. At some tournaments, when all chairs are not filled it is then necessary for those without scorekeepers to keep their own score.

# ARTICLE 11 (Frank Jackson Award)

# SECTION 1

Present language: This award to be given in honor of the first World and Iowa Champion, the legendary Frank Jackson of Kellerton, to that person who has given effort above the call of duty in advancement of horseshoe pitching in Iowa.

Remove the words "to be" and insert: is

Insert: Iowa after Kellerton.
Insert: a period. After Kellerton

Insert at the beginning and creating a new second sentence: It is awarded

Reason: Improvement in reading the Section.

# **MEET HAROLD GARNER**

This summer Harold Garner, with the help of Gerald Weeks, became the caretakers of the IHHPA Hall of Fame Trailer. Harold has met many of the Hall of Famers and has also pitched against several of them. The following is a short chronicle of Harold's remarkable pitching career.

Harold Garner's pitching career began on the farm in the 1940's. There was his Dad, Harold, and Harold's two brothers. They played in the backyard with a light hung in a tree.

In 1954 Harold pitched in his first tournament at the Ringgold County Centennial in Mt. Ayr. In 1978 he played at the World Tournament when it was held in Des Moines. In 1981, he pitched in the World Tournament in Genola, Minnesota, placing 1<sup>st</sup> in Class P3. Harold has played in several other World Tournaments, including 1992, Columbus, Ohio, where he pitched one of his best tournaments, placing, 5<sup>th</sup>; and 1999, Greenville, Ohio, where he placed 1<sup>st</sup> in Class Q2.

Harold has also pitched in eight Team World Tournaments held annually in Beloit, Wisconsin. He played for five years in Las Vegas, where he met lots of people and made a lot of friends.


Harold has played at the Iowa State Fair since 1971, missing only one year. He pitched against Red Henton in a regional tournament at the Fair. Although Harold lost by a score of 50 to 21, they had fourteen "four deads." In 1992, the State Tournament was held in Cedar Rapids, where Harold placed 7<sup>th</sup> in the Championship Class. That same year, Harold beat the late Marv Woollums in Winterset in a playoff for first place.

Harold says one of his best tournaments was in Russell when he won over Bill Vandegriff and Byron Hafner, and of course, won the tournament. After Bill got home, he called Harold to ask him, "if he had got out of the clouds yet."

The best game he has ever thrown was 17 ringers out of 20 shoes.

Harold has also pitched in the Valley of the Sun Tournament in Mesa, Arizona and in Yuma, Quartzite, Glendale, and Apache Junction, all in Arizona. In 2000, Harold and Lois made their first motor journey to Arizona. It has since become a yearly event. Harold enjoys league play there during the winter months. They will be leaving for Arizona again this year right after Christmas.

Harold has some advice to all pitchers: Regardless of your pitching ability, just go out and have fun!!

## **BLIND HORSESHOE TOURNAMENT**

Every year the Veteran's Administration has an athletic event for the blind veterans. Normally they have blind golf and blind bowling. This year they were introduced to blind horseshoes. The Vets Hospital has been host to this special event for several years. Kirt Sickels is the coordinator for all activities. Kirt informed me that seventy of the 106 blind people that were coming to Iowa City has signed up for the horseshoe event. I did not know how to conduct a horseshoe event with that many I contacted Charlie Parcell from Cedar Rapids. Charlie's wife is blind and she also pitches horseshoes. With their help, I found out how it is done, but still did not know what to do with seventy blind pitchers.

The event took place September 12th at 5:00 p.m. at Iowa City Park. The weather was rainy and cold. Thirty-eight of the 70

who signed up chose to pitch. We divided them into six classes, each class was given a color. We had them pitch a round robin of 12 shoes per game. There were approximately 18 attendants from our Iowa City League who helped the blind pitchers as to where to stand and what direction to pitch. Also, the attendants tapped on the stake to help the pitchers' orientation. After a rough start and the pitchers and attendants figured out what to do, things went fairly well.

# DON WILSON GREENFIELD, IOWA 1934 - 2006

Don Wilson, age 71, passed away July 28, 2006 at Iowa Methodist hospital. He was born on October 2, 1934 in Warren County, Iowa. He served in the United States Army from January, 1955 to January, 1958. Don worked as a diesel mechanic for Schwerman Trucking for 23 years, a small engine repair man for several years, retiring in 1997 from Sears.

Don is survived by his wife, Marcella ("Mic"), seven children, 19 grandchildren, four great grandchildren and two sisters.

Since, 1989, Don was a very active member of the IHHPA. He devoted many hours to the publicity of the game of horseshoes and the IHHPA. He served the IHHPA as President and Publicity Director. He was one of the leaders in getting the courts built in Pickard Park in Indianola, Iowa. He spent many hours, physical labor and money in getting those courts built. In 1990, Don started a sanctioned league in Indianola that is still strong today. He held Junior tournaments there at his own expense for several years. For four years, Don was putting on demonstrations and helping kids pitch at the Living History Farms on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July and other dates during this period.

Don was instrumental in obtaining and maintaining the Iowa Hall of Fame trailer. He has been the keeper and maintainer of the Iowa Hall of Fame for many years. Don also spent many years working at the National Hall of Fame exhibit that was located in Pioneer Hall at the Iowa State Fair. Don would talk horseshoes and the IHHPA to anyone that would listen and a few that didn't want to. Don helped Chet Foster with several promotional events for the IHHPA, including one for the Boy Scouts. Don helped and attended most of the tournaments held at the winter indoor facility in Eldora, Iowa, until his health kept him from doing so.

These are but a few of the many things Don has done for the game and for the IHHPA. There are a large number of current and former players that Don has instructed and recruited into the IHHPA. Don would help out in any capacity at tournaments that he attended.

Everyone will miss Don, he was a fine gentleman and asset to the IHHPA and the NHPA. As Don was going into surgery, he was trying to talk the nurses and doctor into playing horseshoes.

Don would be the first to say that he wasn't a poet but this was a short horseshoe pitcher's prayer that he wrote:

May the days be sunny, and the wind be light. Please Lord, let there be no rain in sight.

If I live to be a ripe old age, 100 would be just fine,

Let the last shoe I throw in life, Be a ringer, if that's all right.


