PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASED Members attending the business meeting in Marshalltown approved a six (\$6) dollar increase making the yearly adult dues Thirty-One Dollars (\$31). The NHPA portion increased from \$12 to \$17 and a one-dollar increase was approved for the IHHPA. Our membership numbers now are equal to last year's and cost-saving measures have put us on the plus side from last year. Sending the Newsletter via e-mail has reduced printing and postage expenses. The Newsletter is posted on our website and sent to members who choose to receive it by email. The five-dollar NHPA increase was overwhelmingly approved by delegates at the business meeting in York this year, recognizing that costs have increased since the last dues increase in 1992. There was also a bylaw change concerning dues and language for adult members living at the same address. The bylaw was changed to increase the dues for one adult living at the same address to twenty dollars (\$20). The bylaw regarding junior players also The age a player is passed at the annual meeting. considered a junior was increased from 17 to 18 to conform

to NHPA Language. Our Delegation voted in favor of the five dollar increase in York and after 16 years I feel it was justified. We are fortunate to have a NHPA Sec/Treasurer that is very competent in his many duties and an NHPA Executive Board that is working very hard to improve the sport.

WORLD TOURNAMENT UPDATE Members attending the annual meeting were given the opportunity to sign up for one of the many committees. Committee participation is critical and I am hoping that many of you will be able to help out to make this one great World Tournament. The Contract with the Ice Arena has been signed and we are moving forward confidently. If you are planning to go to the WT in Springfield next year, four sanctioned tournaments are needed twelve months prior to the entry form deadline.

OPEN FORUM

With our declining membership, here is a new way to run a tournament. First we play count all. We play our 5 games just like before, except the individual wins don't count in the final placement in the class. After the games are completed, we tally up all the ringers and single points of the 5 games. The most total points is no. 1-2-3 down the line.

What brings this to mind is when the winner of the class has a ringer percentage of 4th or 5th in the class, this means that most of his opponents, had a bad game when he played them which is no credit to him.

Also why shouldn't our single points be counted in our average at NATSTATS? Or are they just going along for the ride? Single points are important in winning our games - - why not be included in our over all average, which would be points per shoe?

Another advantage of this new game is the lower pitcher has a bigger score to look at, even though he lost the game. It would encourage him to say a member. That is our downfall, we get enough new members every year but then we lose too many out the back door.

What is behind this court sanctioning? The guy that thought that up wasn't overly loaded with common sense. I've been


told it is an image thing. Who is going to stop and admire a horseshoe court? If a guy or gal is judging a court, they are looking at the condition of the clay and a solid stake, I've never saw anyone down measuring a court. I fail to see that this image thing has any bearing whatsoever. Then they follow it up with a price rise of \$5.00 per membership. The combination of these 2 new rules is going to send our membership right down the toilet. Why are we bombarded with this kind of treatment, when our membership is already suffering? It sure doesn't encourage a person to go after a new member, especially when you tell them they have to send \$17.00 a year to our upper classmen.

Now we can say, "This is one of the courts in Hardin County that Putt Mossman pitched horseshoes on!" Thanks everyone for coming to our Tournament.



Horseshoes

hen I was growing up on the farm in the 1920s and 1930s, Sunday afternoons were a time for family, friends and horseshoes. My father and his friends were all lean and hard, working from sunup until sundown at least five-and-a-half days a week. They enjoyed recreation that was relaxing but still competitive. Horseshoes filled the bill. The way they played, it was a slow and easy game. When they were not actually pitching, they discussed everything that had happened on their farms all week.



Pitching horseshoes had the added advantage of being free. Everything needed to play the game was readily available on every farm; two iron stakes and a few horseshoes and they were in business.

Sundays always began the same way in our community. Everyone gathered at the little church in the morning. Afterward, two or three families, including the preacher, would come to one family's home (a different place each week) for a big Sunday dinner around a homemade dining table. When dinner was finished, the cowhide-bottomed chairs became lawn furniture. Everyone picked up a chair and carried it to the front porch or out into the yard under a big tree to sit in the shade.

Their low, comfortable conversation and occasional laughter provided background music for the games we children played. It was sheer contentment and peace.

After a while, one of the men would get up and |

leisurely hammer an iron stake into the ground, step off 40 feet and hammer in another stake. In the meantime, someone else would get some horse-shoes, and the game was on.

They didn't worry about ruining the grass—there wasn't any. Our yard, like everyone else's, was hoed clean of grass and swept with a brush broom. The men played on hard-packed dirt.

They didn't bother with chairs, preferring to stand or squat as they awaited their turn to throw. Then, walking into position, they leaned over with

horseshoe in hand, sighted in on the other stake, swung the arm back and tossed. Swish ... clink ... "Ahaa" That's the soft sound of horseshoes. Just as a baseball player has his favorite bat and the tennis player his favorite racket, each man has his favorite horseshoes, a pair perfectly balanced to his liking. Getting the horseshoes balanced just right before the toss was crucial.

They played without fanfare, cheerleaders or great crowds, but not without champions, even in our small community. The championship changed hands pretty often, though, for all these men were proficient in the game and able to get five or more ringers in a row before losing

out to someone who was just as good.

The game started easy and it ended that way. Toward the end of the long evening, as if by an unseen signal, they would pull up stakes, gather wives and children and head for home. All of them had a lot of chores to do. But they were rested and

ready to get up Monday morning and begin another hard week. The popularity of pitching horseshoes declined during World War II. Small family farms and farming communities like ours almost disappeared as men and boys left for the service, or

moved to large cities to work in defense plants.

However, the game is coming back. I make four reunions a year, and at each, we have horseshoe-pitching contests. We have trophies for doubles as well as single players. We have first- and second-place winners. Everyone has a lot of fun while we get to visit old friends and relatives. *





Membership in IHHPA means you are also a member of the NHPA and entitles you to participate in tournaments throughout the United States. If you would like to join a local league, contact one of the Regional Directors in your area that appears on the front page. For organized tournament participation, there are approximately 60 tournaments a year that you can choose to play in.

REMEMBER. You must pitch in three tournaments at the State level to pitch in the Iowa State Championship. You must pitch in **four** tournaments to pitch in the NHPA World Tournament to be held in Springfield, Illinois in 2009 and Cedar Rapids, Iowa in 2010.
