2011-2012 OUTDOOR SEASON ENDS WITH COVERED BRIDGE FESTIVAL TOURNAMENT AT WINTERSET

Nineteen pitchers, including two from Nebraska, participated in the Covered Bridge Festival Tournament at the Madison County Fairgrounds in Winterset on Saturday, October 13, 2012.

Forecasts of rain and possible severe weather resulted in a smaller-than-average turnout. Rain delayed the start of the tournament, but once underway, the skies lightened and the temperature rose.

Bert Logsdon of Osceola won his third consecutive Class "A" Championship. Other class winners were Carl Kaiser of Des Moines, Class "B," Marv Dirks of Fonda, Class "C," and Jack Navin of West Des Moines, Class "D."



The twelve courts at the Madison County Fairgrounds can accommodate up to 30 pitchers in one session. John Pletchette, who is with the Parks and Recreation Department for the City of Winterset, oversees the annual Fall tournament. John also hosts a middle school physical education class at the courts during the school year, introducing many of the youths to horseshoe pitching for the first time.

2012 IHHPA ANNUAL MEETING

The 2012 Annual Meeting was held Saturday, October 20th in Marshalltown. IHHPA President Bill Sprague presided over the Meeting.

Six offices were up for election. Doug Anderson, 2nd Vice President; Dick Huitt, Secretary Treasurer; Shirley Sprague, Publicity Director; and LeRoy Law, Statistician, were re-elected to their current positions. Steve Hatch was elected 4th Vice President. Each officer will served a two-year term. Dennis Smith resigned as Youth Director and that position was not filled at the Meeting.

Joe Smith of Gladbrook and the late Owen Simmons of Nashua were given this year's Hall of Fame Award. Joe is a nine-time Junior State Champion and won the Iowa State Men's Championship for five consecutive years, 2007 to 2011. Mr. Simmons was given the Hall of Fame Award posthumously. His daughter and son-in-law, Patricia and James Meyer of Cedar Rapids, his granddaughter, Laurie Taylor, and great granddaughters Lynda Taylor and Callie Taylor, accepted the award on his behalf.

Steve "Bones" Ronk of Council Bluffs was awarded this year's Frank Jackson Award. Bones was recognized for his continued work and dedication in organizing league and tournament play in Southwest Iowa.

The President's Award was given by President Sprague to Deb Davis of Ankeny.

Glenn Warden of Grimes was honored as this year's Most Improved Player, having increased his percentage from 45.13% to 59.45% or 14.32%. He narrowly beat out Ronnie Burgess of Cedar Rapids, who went from 31.51% to 45.68% or 14.17%.

CONDOLENCES



Eugene "Gene" Rittman of Ankeny passed away September 5, 2012. Gene was born January 10, 1918, in Minneapolis. He served in the US Army, 34th Division in WWII and was discharged as a Master Sergeant. It was during the War that he met his wife, Gladys, in London. After the war, they moved to the United States. Gene retired in December, 1981, after 41 years

with the Veterans Administration. Gene was a member of the IHHPA and played horseshoes at the Iowa State Fair where he won many first place ribbons.



Leonard Larsen of Des Moines passed away at his home on September 13, 2012. Leonard was born October 4, 1932 in Des Moines. He retired from the Rock Island and Chicago Northwestern Railroad and proudly served his Country in the US Air Force. Leonard played horseshoes in the 1980's and 1990's at the Birdland Courts that were located in Des Moines.



Ron Utley of Des Moines passed away September 29, 2012, at his home. Ron was born February 9, 1935, in Osceola, Iowa. He served his country in the US Air Force. In 1958, he married Rita Monahan from Creston, Iowa. They had three children when Rita tragically passed away at the age of 29. Ron later met and married Margaret Jane Hodson, They were married for over 40 years.

Ron spent most of his career with Fair Play Scoreboards before retiring in 1997. After retirement, Ron helped at the horseshoe courts during the lowa State Fair, assisting LeRoy Law, who was the State Fair Superintendent of Horseshoes at that time, with groundskeeping and maintenance until 2003.



FROM THE NHPA

RULE CHANGES PASSED AT THE KNOXVILLE CONVENTION

Approved Change Of Wording (new wording is in *italic/bold* print):

SECTION E - ELDER MEN: 1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platforms, and shall observe the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter secretary, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must remain *in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased.* At that time he may switch back to the Open Men's Division, but must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased, etc. Note: See RULE 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying.

SECTION E - TOURNAMENT CREDIT. For singles and doubles events, a contestant must have pitched a minimum of 100 shoes to receive NatStats credit. Exception (approved by NHPA Council): If all games of the round-robin schedule have been pitched in less than 100 shoes, these statistics may be submitted for NatStats credit.

RULE 3, SECTION D - POSITION OF CONTESTANTS DURING DELIVERY. (Changes/additions to Rule 3, Section D.1., have been moved to Rule 3, Section C.2 (see RGS Page 10).

- 1. The Pitcher During the entire address **and prior to the release of the shoe** (amended), the contestant must not start or step completely outside the pitching platform with either foot.
- Exceptions:
- (a) A contestant observing the thirty-seven-foot (37') foul line may start directly behind the pitching platform provided they step within it when they release the shoe.
- (b) A physically challenged contestant **requiring the assistance of special equipment**, **such as a wheelchair**, must have at least some contact with the pitching platform and be completely behind the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul line when the shoe is released.

Approved Changes (Part B): It *has been further accepted* that the following text information replace the current text in Section D.2, as follows: Note: This PRC was amended/accepted/approved on the Convention floor. This change of wording is in bold/italic type, as follows:

When not pitching, any contestant shall stand quietly and stationary at least two (2) feet behind any contestant on their court, or on any adjacent court.

Approved Changes (Part C): For editing reasons, it has been accepted that the current text heading for Section D. 3 – The Contestants, will be changed to Section E – Crossing Over, as presented below. The current text information will remain the same, other than the reference change to Section D, in two places. Accepted changes are in bold/italic print.

SECTION E - CROSSING OVER

If both contestants use the same pitching platform to deliver their shoes, the contestant pitching first should cross over (in front of the pit) to the other pitching platform and then move back to the position described in Section D, above. As the first contestant is crossing over in front, the second contestant should be crossing over and onto the same pitching platform, from the rear. If the contestants use opposite pitching platforms, the contestant who pitches first should step directly back, to the position described in Section D, above.

SECTION C - DELIVERY OF SHOES

1. Delivery — The contestant pitching first shall deliver both shoes (*underhand*, *and* one at a time) and then the other contestant shall deliver both shoes (*underhand*, *and* one at a time). A contestant may deliver the shoes from either the left or right pitching platform, but in any one inning, both shoes must be delivered from the same platform. A contestant shall pitch the entire tournament with the same hand/arm, except in the case of a medical emergency (to be determined by the Tournament/League Officials).

PRC8B - RULE 1, SECTION A - JUNIORS Junior Cadets (any pitcher *twelve (12)* years old or younger for the entire calendar year).

SECTION F - PLAYOFFS

In World Tournament play, games won and lost shall determine the order in which the winners are placed. If there is a tie for first place, a playoff game will determine the winner. All playoff games will follow the same format as the round-robin play for that Class. If more than two players tie for first place, a ladder-type playoff will be used, based on ringer percentages in that competition. All other ties (second place and below) will be determined by ringer percentage. If still tied, "who beat who", and then "ringer % vs entry %" will be used. Note: Percentage ties for all move-up positions shall be broken by a playoff game. If still tied, additional innings will be played (see Rule 8, Section B.2).

RULE 11, SECTION G - FORFEITS

If, for any reason, a pitcher must forfeit a game prior to its completion, this player will receive a loss for that game and any accumulated statistics (shoes, points, ringers) for that game will be deleted from their records. His/her opponent will receive a win for that game, and if there are any accumulated statistics (shoes, points, ringers), they will remain in his/her records.* A contestant may forfeit any number of games, due to illness, injury, or other legitimate reasons approved by the Tournament/League Officials, and still be permitted to return to the competition. Any contestant who forfeits such games will finish wherever their W/L record puts them in the standings, unless they forfeit for unapproved reasons (see NHPA Bylaws, Article III, Section 8, a-d). If so, they will not be allowed to return to the competition, will be moved to last place in the standings, and will forfeit all prize money and/or awards for that event. If forfeiting games for unapproved reasons, this contestant will also be subject to a one (1) year suspension from the NHPA (see NHPA Bylaws, Article III, Sections 8-11); to be decided later by the Charter and NHPA Officers.

* Please note: If a forfeited game is "in progress", a Pacer should be used so that this game can be completed for the opponent.

NHPA Hall of Fame Nominations

Nominations to the NHPA Hall of Fame may be made by an individual NHPA member or NHPA Sanctioned Club. The nomination form can be found on the NHPA website at the Hall of Fame menu. All nominees must have been active NHPA adult members for at least 10 years.

Nomination Categories are:

Player - a person who, with distinguished outstanding performances in World Tournament Championship play, has brought prestige to the art of horseshoe pitching.

Promoter/Organizer - A person who has made significant and beneficial contributions to the NHPA in an administrative capacity; such as promoter, organize or NHPA officer.

Player / Organizer - A person who has excellent credentials in both of the two other categories.

All nominations will be reviewed by the Hall of Fame Screening Committee before candidates are placed on the ballot. Nomination deadline is January 31, 2013. For more information, see the NPHA website, www.horseshoepitching.com

IHHPA HALL OF FAME REVEREND DAVID A. SHAEFFER

David Shaeffer was born on July 12, 1909 in Newell, Iowa and passed away February 23, 1994. His father taught him to play horseshoes as a young boy when they lived in Storm Lake, and he continued to play for the rest of his life. He served as the publicity director for the IHHPA for many years. He enjoyed interviewing players and was the editor of the Iowa Horseshoe Association newsletter.

As a minister, he was moved by the Church to several different towns in Minnesota and Iowa. He always had to have horseshoe courts in the backyard alongside the garden.

In the 1950's, during Iowa State Fair, he would vacation with his family at the fairgrounds camping area where they would sleep in a tent so he could be involved in the horseshoe pitching tournaments. His daughter, Harriet, remembers scorekeeping during the State Fair, earning ten cents per game!

Rev. Shaeffer installed horseshoe courts in many different towns around lowa for their Old Settlers celebrations. He would go the old clay pits and get the very best clay for the courts. He also put on several pitching exhibitions, including an appearance on the Mary Jane Chin show, a local television show in Des Moines. He would place

wooden stick matches around a stake and light them with the toss of a horseshoe. He could throw ringers over a blanket held in front of the stake.

He played in many tournaments because he loved the sport. He loved visiting with other pitchers and watching them play. He was known to tape record horseshoe matches, giving a play-by-play account of the game. Harriet remembers as a young girl on summer nights going to sleep to the sound of horseshoes clanging on metal stakes.

COURT SIDE RECIPES

Connie Kollasch, wife of IHHPA member, Vern Kollasch, made this soup for the Eldora lunches a few years ago. Vern also brought a version of this soup made with venison sausage.

ITALIAN PASTA SAUSAGE SOUP

- 1 lb. hot or sweet Italian sausage links
- 1 28 oz. can whole tomatoes, undrained, cut up (I use 1 can diced tomatoes with basil, garlic, and oregano and add tomato juice)
- 1 14 1/2 oz. can ready to serve chicken broth
- 1 8 oz. can tomato sauce
- 1 tsp dried basil leaves
- 1 tsp dried oregano leaves
- 1 16 oz. pkg. frozen pasta, broccoli, corn and carrots in garlic-seasoned sauce

Grated fresh Parmesan cheese

Place sausage links in large saucepan or 5-quart Dutch oven. Add water to depth of about 1/2 inch. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 10 minutes or until sausage is partially cooked. Drain. Slice sausage into 1/2" slices, return to saucepan. Add tomatoes, broth, tomato sauce, basil and oregano; blend well. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Stir in frozen vegetables with pasta. Cover; bring to boil. Reduce heat, simmer 3 to 5 minutes or until vegetables are crisp-tender. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.


