





NHPA Hall of Fame Nominations

Nominations to the NHPA Hall of Fame may be made by an individual NHPA member or NHPA Sanctioned Club. The nomination form can be found on the NHPA website at the Hall of Fame menu. All nominees must have been active NHPA adult members for at least 10 years.

Nomination Categories are:

Player - a person who, with distinguished outstanding performances in World Tournament Championship play, has brought prestige to the art of horseshoe pitching.

Promoter/Organizer - A person who has made significant and beneficial contributions to the NHPA in an administrative capacity; such as promoter, organize or NHPA officer.

Player / Organizer - A person who has excellent credentials in both of the two other categories.

All nominations will be reviewed by the Hall of Fame Screening Committee before candidates are placed on the ballot. Nomination deadline is January 31, 2014. For more information, see the NPHA website, www.horseshoepitching.com

IHHPA HALL OF FAME LEROY LAW



LeRoy Law of West Des Moines was inducted into the IHHPA Hall of Fame in 2008. In the nomination letter, LeRoy was recognized for his participation, tournament directing, and countless hours in bidding for the World Tournament to come to Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

LeRoy was the 2007 and 2012 Iowa Seniors Champion. He was a member of the State Regional Team Champion in 1998, 1999, 2002, 2004, 2005 and 2006. He was the Professional Champion of the 2009 State Pro-Am Championship.

LeRoy has been introducing Iowa State Fair-goers to the sport of horseshoes by hosting Pitch and Win contests. Every weekday during the State Fair, LeRoy barks on the microphone asking people to pitch four horseshoes. "It's free and everyone wins a ribbon!" LeRoy contacts local businesses for the prizes he gives away, including cash prizes for adults and bicycles for kids.

My involvement in the sport of horseshoe pitching began at an early age. Growing up on the East side of Des Moines there were alleys between streets separating homes on the next block. Adjacent to the alleys there were several horseshoe pit locations. All you needed were a couple of old car axels pounded in the ground. Kids back then did not have the activities available to them they do now. Football, baseball and basketball were top priorities during school years, but I always found time to go out behind the house to pitch some shoes. Neighbors were drawn to the pits by the sound of the shoes and soon joined in pitching. It was a good way to get to know your neighbors.

One day the paper announced that a City Junior Horseshoe tournament would be held at the Birdland courts in Des Moines. That's when I found out that pitching on clay was very different than dropping your shoe into a dirt hole and have it slide to the stake.

In 1964, at the age of 26 I purchased a set of four Gordon "Spin Ons " and two stakes. With the purchase was a form to order a brochure of "Science at the Stake" that cost 50 cents (now on the NHPA web site). This gave me the opportunity to experiment with different turns and methods. I have been experimenting ever since. Some say this is bad that you should stay with one delivery and not change. To me that would take the fun out of the game. Staying with the same model horseshoe and never changing is also probably good advice. To me experimenting with different shoes is just another way to make the sport interesting.

There was a period of raising four children and that meant time for only occasional "pitching shoes". Later, In 1990, I went to Holiday Park in West Des Moines to practice and met three gentleman that were instrumental in my joining the IHHPA and attending tournaments - Rick Voshell, Keith Baker and Slim Allen. They were at the courts that day and before I left, I had a membership form and tournament schedule in my hand. I played my first tournament in Boone Iowa.

I believe it was the next year that I began directing tournaments at Holiday Park. Then I began directing the Senior Olympics Horseshoe Tournaments and starting the Wednesday Night Horseshoe League. After working for Chet Foster on the work crew at the Fair, I had the pleasure of taking over as the Iowa State Fair Superintendent for six years.

Approximately ten years ago I read of a "Pitch & Win" Program that Don Titcomb had developed for County Fairs and thought it would be good to adapt this program for the lowa State Fair. Between one and two thousand youngsters and adults have been introduced to horseshoe pitching during this time. Each year we have given away two bicycles for the kids and cash awards for the adults. This year, through donations, it has grown to around \$800 worth of prizes. This is an enjoyable event that I look forward to each year.

In 2008 I was fortunate enough to become the President of the IHHPA and served for four years. My goals then
