COURTS AT TROEGER PARK, OTTUMWA



There are 12 courts at Troeger Park in Ottumwa, near the banks of the Des Moines River. The original 18 courts were installed under the supervision of Bill and Mary Lou Burgess. Bill Burgess was a Commissioner with the City of Ottumwa Parks Department.

In the early 1970's, pitchers in Class A averaged 80%

or better. Some of the great Iowa pitchers - - Dale Dixon, Leland Mortensen, John Paxton, Glen Henton, Charlie Foxx, Bill Vandegriff, and Harold Darnold - - played on the courts in Ottumwa.

Lights were installed in 2013. John Peterson has hosted the Ottumwa tournaments for the last four years. This year the tournament moved from August to May. There were thirty-six players at the tournament held May 17th.



Joe Martin and Jean McNichols of North Dakota played at the May 17 Tournament in Ottumwa, then traveled to Osceola the next day to play in that tournament.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

It is time to solicit nominations for our Association's Hall of Fame and Frank Jackson Awards. Deadline for nominations is July 14, 2014.

Hall of Fame Award: The purpose of the Hall of Fame Award is to honor and perpetuate the names of those members who have displayed outstanding ability in the game of horseshoes and/or who have contributed through meritorious service to the general welfare and progress of the game and/or who have pitched horseshoes for a great number of years. The successful candidate must receive 75% of the vote cast with a minimum of seven members voting. There can be multiple successful candidates, and there may be no nominee if the 75% vote is not met. Members inducted into this select group consider this to be a great honor, and many continue to promote the sport of horseshoes.

Frank Jackson Award: This award is given to that person who has given effort above the call of duty in advancement of horseshoe pitching in Iowa. Only one successful candidate by majority vote.

Hall of Fame and Frank Jackson Awards are elected by the Hall of Fame Board which consists of the Executive Board of IHHPA, Regional Chairpersons, and a Nomination Committee appointed by the IHHPA President. The nominations for the Awards are from you, the Membership, by submitting a brief description of accomplishments and reasons you feel your candidate deserves the recognition. If you know individuals that fit the criteria for either of the above awards, please send information to me. Include in your nomination their name. how long they have been actively involved with horseshoes, their specific accomplishments and things you feel that make these horseshoe pitchers special. These nominations do not need to be lengthy. In fact, we appreciate nominations that are concise and to the point. The committee needs your help identifying these individuals so their efforts may be properly recognized.

Ralph Palmer and Larry Purcell were inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2013. Other IHHPA Hall of Famers are Joe Smith and Owen Simmons (2012), Keith Baker (2011); LeRoy Law (2008); Harold Garner (2007); Leo Buell (2005) and Marv Engstler (2004). Past winners of the Frank Jackson Award are Steve Ronk (2012); James Jackson and Stoney Jackson (2011); Bob Bown (2008); Leo Buell (2007); Dave Sidles (2006); Bob and Marian McKee; (2005); Mic Wilson (2005); and Gerald Weeks (2002).

All nominees from last year are eligible in 2014 and 2015 if not successfully elected.

IHHPA HALL OF FAME RALPH PALMER

Ralph Palmer of Cedar Rapids was inducted into the IHHPA Hall of Fame in 2013. Ralph's dad introduced horseshoe pitching to Ralph at the age of 10 on a farm near Gilman, Iowa. His dad placed a two-foot stick in the corn crib next to his horseshoe pits. He would give Ralph a point for each shoe that landed in the corn crib. While in high school, Ralph showed pigs at the Iowa State Fair and discovered the location of the horseshoe courts. In 1975, Ralph played in an open tournament at the Fair and won \$5. He has never cashed that check. Ralph started pitching at Ellis Park in Cedar Rapids that same year and was encouraged to joint the league by a young Ronnie Burgess. Ralph's passion and support of horseshoe

pitching both at the local and state level has been exceptional and his love for the game continues.

Ralph's ambition to bring a World Tournament to Cedar Rapids began 25 years ago in 1988 when he flew to Pleasanton, California to bid on bringing the World Tournament back to Iowa. Ralph and others from Cedar Rapids each contributed \$1,000 to make the bid. They did not win the bid, and the money was returned. In 2007, with the help of the Cedar Rapids Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB), Ralph, IHHPA Member LeRoy Law, and Mary Lee Malmberg of the CVB, made a presentation to bring the World Tournament to Cedar Rapids. Cedar Rapids was eliminated on the first round. With increased support from the CVB, a trip was made the next year to York, Despite the flooding conditions in 2008, Pennsylvania. Cedar Rapids won the bid to host the 2010 World Tournament on the first vote.

Under Ralph's direction, the 2010 World Tournament was a huge financial success, generating over \$35,000, enabling the IHHPA to establish a grant program and junior scholarship program, thus supporting and promoting horseshoe pitching throughout lowa.

One of the best ways to promote horseshoe pitching is to let the public know that it exists. Ralph has found a way to do this and at the same time generate financial support for various charities. In 1999, Ralph pitched horseshoes for 24 straight hours, pitching intervals of 100 ringers or 50 minutes, whichever came first. At the end of the 24 hours, Ralph pitched, 2,400 ringers at an average of 50%, and raised \$20,000, which was split between Camp Courageous of lowa and Child Protection of Eastern lowa.

Ralph participated in another promotion. He built a pit on wheels that was pulled by a golf cart With each ringer, he would advance the pit 40 feet until the cart went a total of three miles. The six hour event raised money for his charities and at the same time, promoted horseshoe pitching.

For his contribution to the sport of horseshoes through skill in participation, tournament directing, countless hours promoting the sport, bidding for a World Tournament, and contributing to the IHHPA, please consider Ralph Palmer for the IHHPA Hall of Fame - - submitted by Vern McGrath, Dubuque, Iowa

We pitched against some of the best horseshoe pitchers in the country, including at least two former World Champions, Dale Lipovsky ('82, '83, and '87) from Minnesota, and Mark Seibold ('79 and '87) from Indiana. This was my first Team World and I had a great time.

Vern did an excellent job of tracking our opponents throughout the tournament and then lining up our players to our best advantage when we won the toss and could pick who each of us would pitch. We had some really tough, close games, and came up on the short end; we had a couple games where we surprised our opponents who might have expected an easy win and didn't get it; and we had games where we just didn't pitch up to our potential and lost.

It was a lot of fun and other than the very cold weather the first two mornings, it was a great time.
