

2014 IHHPA HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE RAY DAUGHERTY



Ray Daughtery of Council Bluffs was inducted into the IHHPA Hall of Fame in 2014. He began pitching horseshoes early in his life on his parent's farm. In the early 1970's, he was one of the four original founders of

the Southwest Iowa Horseshoe Pitching Association (SWIPA).

The Association was formed to promote and organize horseshoe pitching in Southwest Iowa. Tournaments at this time were held during small town celebrations. Ray attended every local tournament, doing his share to promote horseshoe pitching.

Ray and fellow IHHPA Hall of Famer, Darrell Nation, along with Jan Flemming, and Jim Hackett, would load up a trailer and drive to a small town on a Sunday. They would stake out 20 or 30 pits and have a tournament. After the tournament, they would pull up the stakes, load up the trailer and do it all over again in another small town the next Sunday.

In 1972, Ray and others encouraged the City of Hancock, Iowa to allow SWIHPA to build 18 horseshoe courts in their city park. In 1982, he was instrumental in getting the City of Council Bluffs to allow 21 courts at Sunset Park

Ray was a 50% pitcher at his peak. He retired from pitching at age 75, choosing not to move up to thirty feet. He pitched in many state tournaments in Des Moines, as well as other tournaments outside the Southwest Iowa area.

Ray held the office of IHHPA Chairman of Regional Directors in the early 1980's. He is still involved as a tournament director at every horseshoe tournament in Council Bluffs. He is always there, encouraging fellow horseshoe friends to come and enjoy the sport he loves.

FROM THE NHPA LONGEVITY PATCHES

NPHA Standing Rule #16. The NHPA shall provide longevity patches to those who reach 10, 20, 30, 40, and 50 years of membership. These accumulated years do not have to be consecutive or all from the same Charter. It is up to each Charter to track these years and to report them to the NHPA Secretary-Treasurer. Those who reach 50 years of membership shall be granted a

lifetime membership to the NHPA and will not be required to pay NHPA annual dues. Charter membership dues may still be required, depending on the decision of that Charter/State Association. Benefits for lifetime members will include, but are not limited to, a lifetime NHPA membership card.

To my knowledge, Ronnie Burgess of Cedar Rapids is the only IHHPA member who has been recognized for 50 years of NHPA membership. Please let me know if you are a 50 year member of the NHPA, any charter. Membership years do not need to be consecutive. You will no longer have to pay NHPA dues and you will receive the lifetime NPHA membership card. Also, if you are entitled to a 10, 20, 30, or 40 year patch, please email, call or send me a note with the years in which you have pitched (for example, 1975 to 2015). HORSESHOE PITCHING EXHIBITION

I have been making plans for over a year to hold an exhibition horseshoe pitching event at the newly renovated nine horseshoe courts at Waterloo's Byrnes City Park, to be held in conjunction with the annual 'My Waterloo Days' celebration held in June. It would be held on Saturday June 11th.

I have a three-part plan in mind; A demonstration session, a learn-to-pitch session, and an exhibition tournament session, which could be a pro/am event or if there aren't enough interested people, an exhibition tournament with our sanctioned members pitching.

The day would begin with an information and demonstration phase. Members would be introduced and would demonstrate how they pitch the horseshoe, the grip they use and the brand of horseshoes they are using. This phase would showcase the various grips, turns, flips and some of the different styles of shoes that are being pitched. For this phase I would like to have pitchers of every style of turn pitching and flippers on hand. I would want it to include men, women, juniors and cadets, pitching from the various distances allowed for each group.

The second phase would be the 'Learn to Pitch' session, where anyone watching who would like to give our sport a try, could come out and pair up with one of our members for some one-on-one instruction, then throwing a few to get the idea and the feel of pitching, followed by pitching 20 shoes to be recorded on a score sheet, which they can keep.

Then for the third phase in the afternoon, I plan to hold an exhibition tournament. This would be either of two possible scenarios. If we have enough interested first time players to fill our courts (we would need 18), we can have a pro/am doubles event. If not, I would just put on an exhibition tournament showcasing a typical round robin tournament with our IHHPA sanctioned players. If we go with this option, it would be limited to only 18 players, three 6 man classes, since we would only have time for a single round, due to the afternoon start time. I would think it could be a sanctioned event if we went with all sanctioned players.

I would very much like to have as many of our members as possible show up for this event, to showcase our sport and hopefully attract and bring in some new members to our association.



TO EVERYBODY WHO HAS A HEART (Reprinted from March 9, 2012 e-mail from Jerry LaBrosse, 4th Vice President NHPA)

There is something I feel very strongly about and have talked about many times over the years that I would like to mention one more time.

I recently received an e-mail from Diana Ratliff, MD. In the email, she talked about the idea developed by Bob Rasmussen of attaching emergency information to the clipboards so the scorekeepers had instant access to it. Bob also suggested that an announcement be included about the information, and also who was on site that was trained in CPR.

As you all know, our membership is aging. The Elders Division is the fastest growing division in the World Tournament. You also should understand that charter and national officers have a responsibility to serve our membership to the best of our abilities, and that would include savings their life if they were having a heart attack. I want to suggest that all charters talk about this at their Spring meetings. Have your charter officers and all tournament directors seek out a community course on CPR and get certified. It's very easy to do, and very inexpensive. Also consider purchasing an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) and have it available at larger tournaments. It's a simple machine that could save a life.

I'm sure that there are many cases of a member experiencing a heart attack at a horseshoe tournament. I have seen two Minnesota members die at horseshoe tournaments in Minnesota over my career.

I want to thank Diana for the reminder, and thought the timing would be good to share this information with everybody to take to their Spring meetings. Get certified now before your season gets into full swing this Spring. The life you save will be a member of your family . . . your horseshoe family!!!
