My Waterloo Days, continued from front page

I have to say I was a little more than disappointed in the number of spectators that showed up for our event. The hot air balloon rally that was scheduled to take off in the open field just to the west of our courts between 6 and 8 am, was canceled due to the weather. That event usually draws very large crowds of spectators and I had hoped to attract that crowd over to our event right after the balloons took off, with a very loud, **"Good Morning Waterloo!!! Are you ready for some Horseshoes?"** belted out over our sound system. That was to going to be my lead-in to the whole outline of information I had prepared to deliver that morning.

But we didn't have a power unit at the courts at that time, therefore, no sound system. Apparently the MWD committee forgot about getting a power unit for our event. I owe a very special thanks to my daughter, Heidi, who, through her persistence, got us the sound system. **Thank you, Heidi!** Unfortunately by the time we got it set up, I had shouted most of my explanation of the game, our early history, the scoring and player introductions to the meager group we had assembled on the bleachers.

Our exhibition included multiple demonstrations of the various turns and flips our players use and I explained the different distances we use depending on which category we fall into. I had Joe Smith and Jason Clark put on a short exhibition match with each of them using some antique pitching shoes dating from back in the 1920's. Joe was throwing his 1923 National Standard horseshoes, while Jason was using one pair of the two antique sets I brought. I then introduced Malcolm Clark and Glen Henton for their exhibition game. Ronnie

Burgess took over the microphone during that game commenting as they pitched; occasionally handing it off to Red who entertained the crowd with some of his jokes and humorous stories. At the conclusion of their exhibition match, I announced the Learn to Pitch and Pitch with a Pro session and invited anyone who would like to come out and give horseshoe pitching a try.

A reporter from the Waterloo Courier showed up during the morning, he took some photos and interviewed a couple of our members for his story. He also gleaned some information about Red and Malcolm from my displays on the table, which he then weaved into his article for the Sunday morning paper. His front page article covered all of the events that ran on Saturday, and detailed the remaining events that were to conclude Sunday evening. He included a short paragraph about Malcolm and Red, but didn't have any photos. Once I got home I looked on the Waterloo/Cedar Falls Courier website to see if they posted anything there. It opened up with a very nice picture of Kelly Turbett pitching when I first looked at it.

As for the tournament, there was a pretty good breeze blowing that day, which helped keep the players cooler in the heat, but it hampered the shoes and averages were affected; 12 of the 18 players pitched below their average for the tournament. We had one six man class and three four man classes which I had pitch a double round. Larry Purcell won the A class, 6-0. Dave Mittlestadt won Class B, 5-0; he also pitched the highest game in that class with 62.5% in his third game. Class C champion was Chris Jordan, 5-1; she also had the highest game in her class hitting 35% in each of her first two games. Class D winner was Ralph Davis, who tied with Steve Faught at 5-1; but Ralph edged Steve on ringer percentage to take the 1st place honors. They also shared the high game honors in their class each hitting a 25% game. Other than the heat, humidity and the wind, we had a good tournament. The clay was kept in excellent condition by the players as they pitched their games.

I want to say a special thank you to the Waterloo League players who stepped up and helped me with this event. Beginning with Justin Kuecker and Steve Faught who came over Friday night and helped trim, edge and blow off the courts while I mowed the grass. Thanks also to Heidi Kuecker who, like me, got up before 5 am that day and came to my house to help haul and then unload everything and begin setting it up. She was my right arm that day doing the running around gathering things for me, and I really appreciate her help. She also took the bulk of the pictures that day to document this event for me. For all you Facebook folks, most of those pictures can be seen on the Waterloo Metro Horseshoe Pitching League's Face book page. Check it out!

Thanks also to Bob Engemann and Steve Faught who arrived around 7 am and assisted with setting up the two canopies, display boards, banner, table displays, scoreboards, chairs and tables. Steve Faught also brought the two large ice water tanks and cups, which I'm sure, were a welcome respite for the pitchers in between games. Thanks also goes out to Deb Davis for her assistance with fixing the glitches I ran into with the HS Master program. I was stumped and without her help I would have been there a lot longer figuring it out. At the conclusion of our event, it was Heidi Kuecker, Steve Faught, Bob Engemann and Joe Smith who stayed afterward to help with the tear down, and loading of everything up in the trucks. Thanks everyone, for all your help, I couldn't have done this without it. Maybe our event didn't run as smoothly as I had hoped, but we learned a lot and hope our next effort goes a lot smoother!
