#### WINTERSET STUDENTS INTRODUCED TO HORSESHOE PITCHING

Horseshoe pitching continues to be a part of the Winterset Junior High Physical Education (P.E.) Program. Each fall since 1991, Winterset Junior High students have enjoyed coming out to the horseshoe courts during their P.E. Class time. John Pletchette, longtime City of Winterset Parks and Recreation Director coordinates this instructional program as well as the sanctioned tournaments at the Madison County Fairgrounds 12 courts. The format for the horseshoe program has changed very little over the years.

When the program started in 1991, Pletchette's wife, Jean, was one of the Winterset P.E. teachers and the program was 3 days for only 8<sup>th</sup> grade students (3 classes each day). Today the program is for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades with a total of 8 different classes over two days. Each of the 8 class sizes range from 30 to 60 students. Each class is scheduled for two 40 minute classes at the horseshoe courts. Last year the first class arrived around 8:20 am and the last class of the day at 12:30 pm. on October 1.

The purpose of the program is to introduce the game of horseshoes to Winterset students. The program involves basic instruction, demonstrations, a hand-out and plenty of time to pitch. Students are introduced to scoring, rules, 3 different types of grips, and pitching fundamentals. Following about 15 minutes of instructions/demonstrations on the first day, each class is then divided into 2-person teams, and they play doubles during the remainder of class time. The second day at the courts is all pitching. The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boy and girl

with the most ringers are awarded a Champion WPRD t-shirt each year.

The following safety procedures are used when students are pitching. All students on one end begin pitching at the sound of a whistle. Students on the other end stand behind a line painted on the grass 10 feet behind the backboard. When ALL students on the one end are done pitching, a whistle is again sounded. Teammates on the other end pick up the horseshoes. When students on the other end are safely behind the 10-foot line, the whistle is sounded and the horseshoes begin flying again......

Kyle is the first WMHPL member to



#### **CALL FOR NOMINATIONS**

It is time to solicit nominations for our Association's Hall of Fame and Frank Jackson Awards. Deadline for nominations is July 31, 2019.

Hall of Fame Award: The purpose of the Hall of Fame Award is to honor and perpetuate the names of those members who have displayed outstanding ability in the game of horseshoes and/or who have contributed through meritorious service to the general welfare and progress of the game and/or who have pitched horseshoes for a great number of years. Hall of Fame and Frank Jackson Awards are elected by the Hall of Fame Board which consists of the Executive Board of IHHPA, Regional Chairpersons, and a Nomination Committee appointed by the IHHPA President. The nominations for the Awards are from you, the Membership, by submitting a brief description of accomplishments and reasons you feel your candidate deserves the recognition. If you know individuals that fit the criteria for either of the above awards, please send information to me. Include in your nomination their name, how long they have been actively involved with horseshoes, their specific accomplishments and things you feel that make these horseshoe pitchers special. These nominations do not need to be lengthy. In fact, we appreciate nominations that are concise and to the point. The committee needs your help identifying these individuals so their efforts may be properly recognized.
